REDIENTS: blespoons fat ap diced onion up diced green pepper und ground beef ounce cans tomato sauce up tomato catsup olespoon Worcestershire

PARING THE FLUFFY TE RICE: Put 11/2 cups of

uncooked rice, 3 cups of cold water and 11/2 teaspoons of salt into a 2-quart saucepan and Do not remove lid nor stir rice while it is cooking. Leave saucepan over this low heat for 14 minutes. After the rice has cooked, remove saucepan from heat - but keep the lid on until the

rice is to be served. Use exact measurements of uncooked rice and water. Time the cooking accurately. For extra convenience and economy of time and effort, cook 2 cups of rice, 4 cups of water and 2 teaspoons of salt - keeping the extra cups of unused rice, already cooked, in the refrigerator in a covered container. Use it as needed in quick, delicious and inexpensive soups, salads, casserole dishes, hot breads and

desserts. METHOD: Melt the fat in a saucepan or skillet. Fry the onion, green pepper and beef in the fat until the onion and pepper are tender and the beef is cooked through and slightly browned. Add more fat if necessary to keep mixture from sticking. Add the tomato sauce, the tomato catsup, Worcestershire sauce, salt and pepper. Cook over a low heat for 10 minutes. Serve over the hot cooked rice. This recipe makes 10 servings.

Native Towns Get Modern Water Systems

Modern water systems for domestic use and fire fighting have been installed in the native villages of Kincolith, Greenille and Aiyansh on the Naas River, F. E. Anfield, superintendent of Indian affairs here, said today.

Housing about 1,250 persons the villagers may now install nodern plumbing in their homes. Many homeowners are expected to do so if the summer produces a good return from fishing, said Mr. Anfield.

Labor on the jobs was provided by the village residents. O. Finsand, project engineer for he Indian Affairs branch, reported that he had received splendid co-operation from the villagers. In the past three years he has installed 27 water systerms in Indian villages but nowhere, he said, had he worked with finer people than on the
