Group Checks Rate on Cones

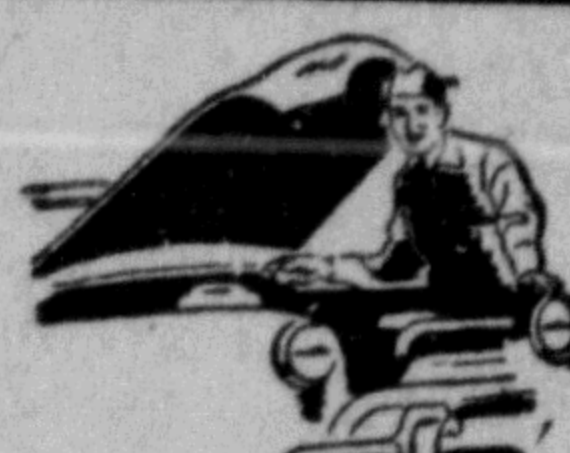

Londoners Face Masks For Smog

LONDON (AP)—Millions of Londoners who carried gas masks for nearly six years during the Second World War soon may be toting a new type of mask—this time as protection against winter "killer fogs."

A London medical committee representing 6,000 general practitioners Tuesday urged Londoners to make themselves simple gauze masks for use during the oncoming smog season.

The committee said nearly all 6,000 deaths caused by sulphuric fumes of the smog of last year could have been avoided by a gauze mask costing only a part of a dime to make.

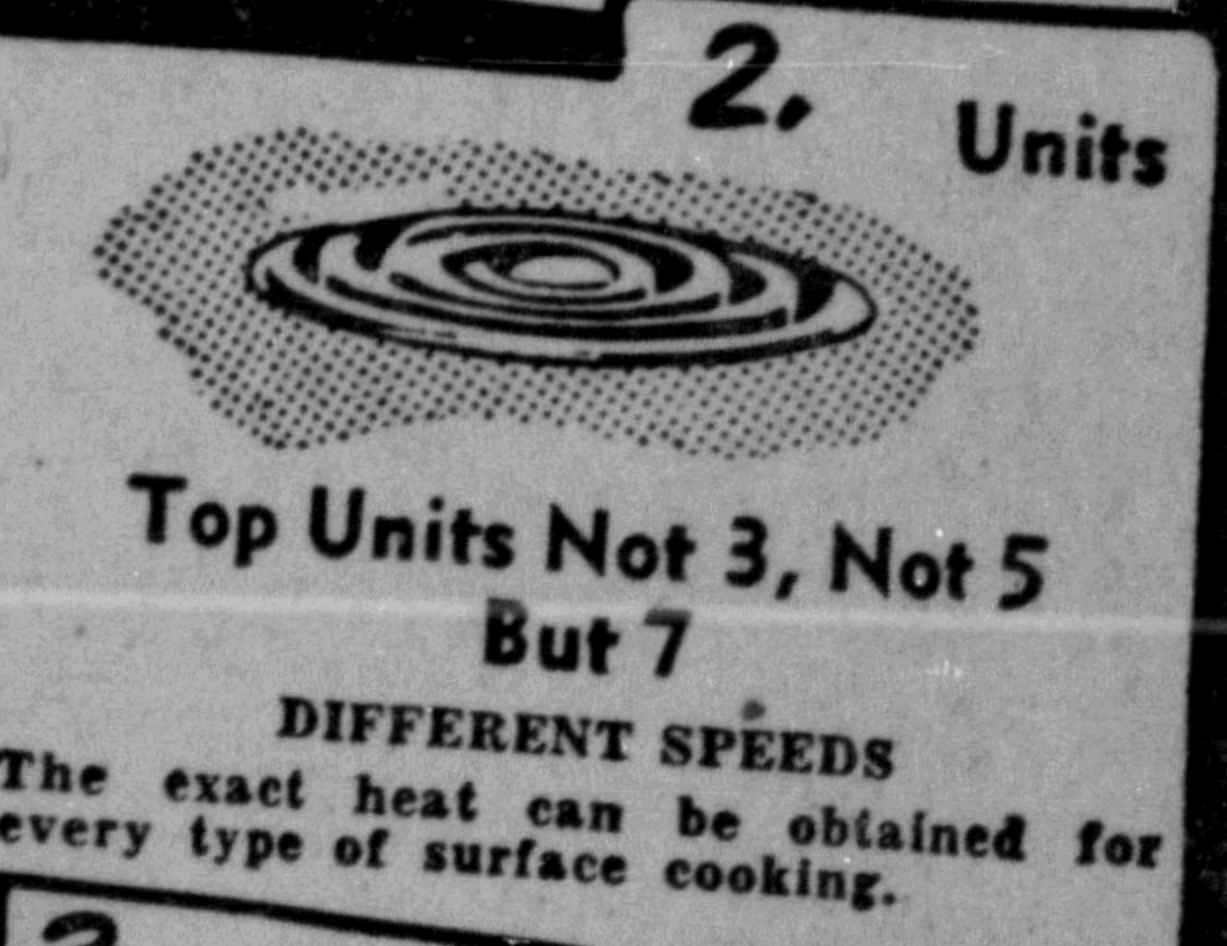

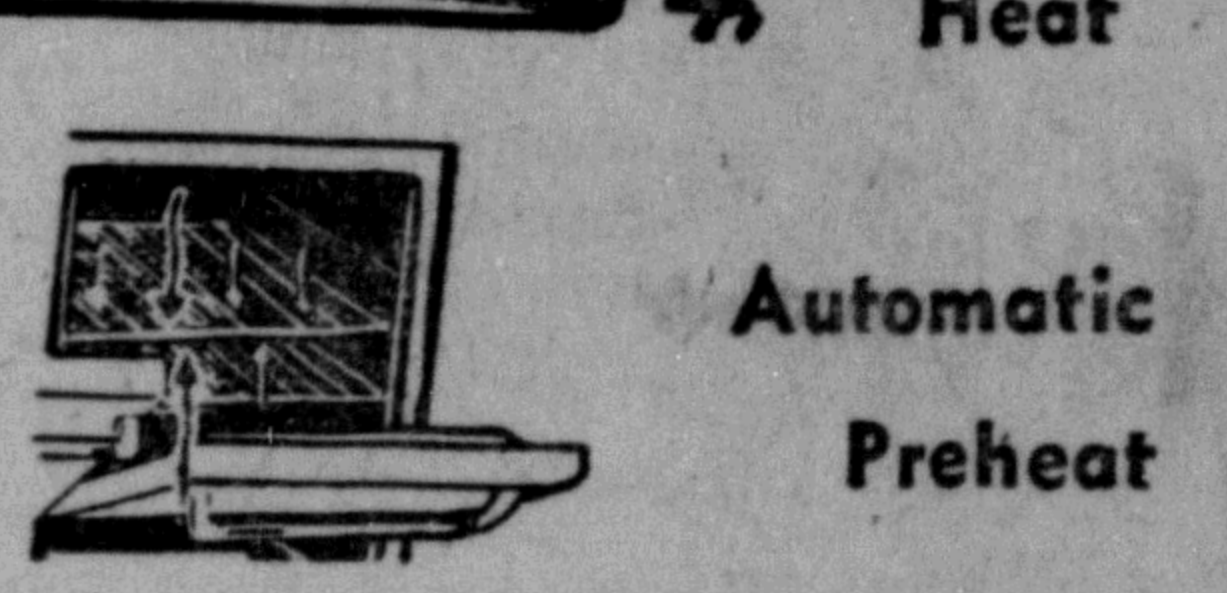

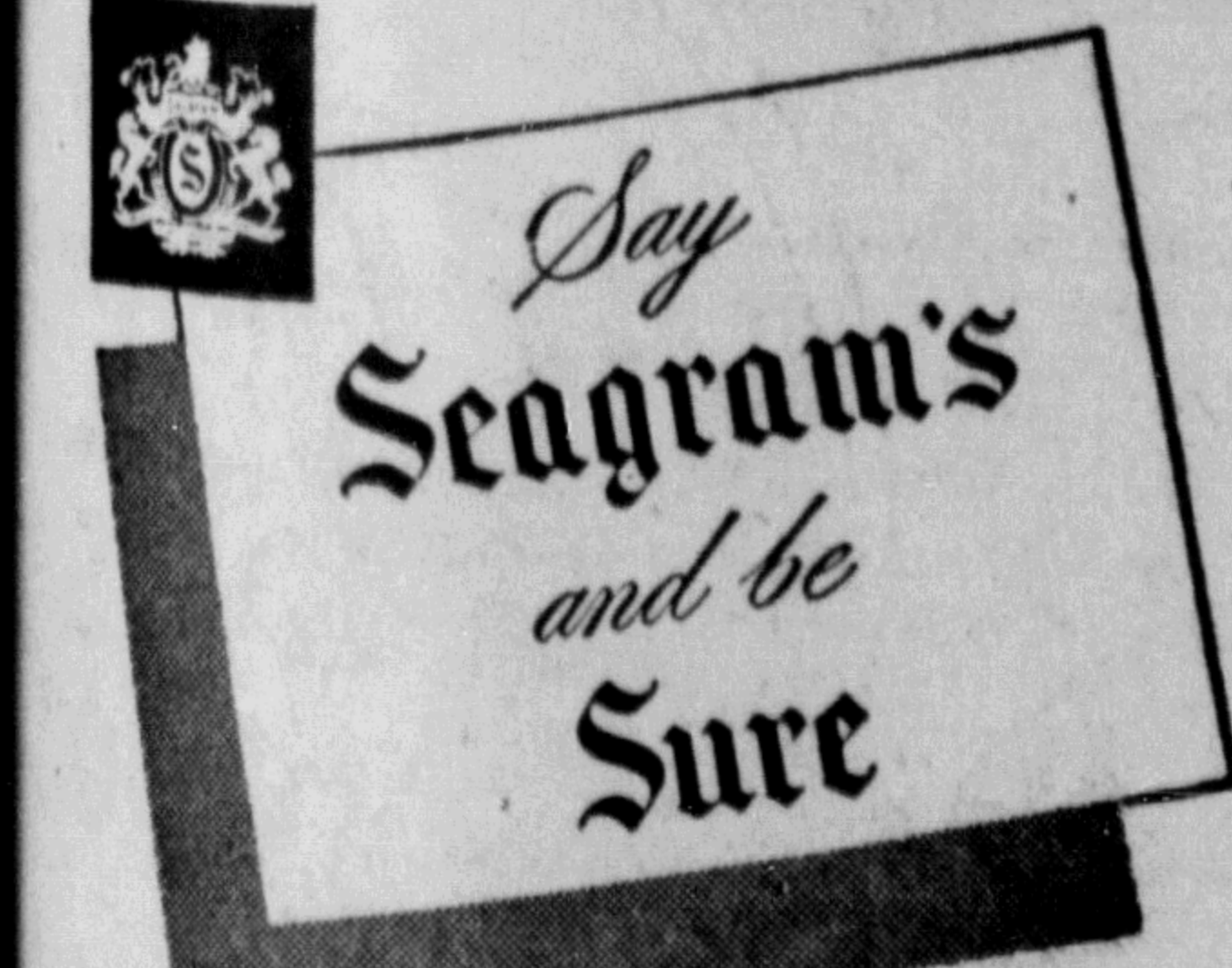
