## Rupert Man Leaves by Air To Attend Logging Congress

SEATTLE.—The world's largest display of logging machinery, worth \$3,000,000 will be shown at Seattle's Civic Auditorium Nov. 3 to 6, inclusive, when the Pacific Logging Congress holds its 44th annual convention.

The huge assortment of powerful logging equipment will fill the entire basement level of the auditorium and overflow onto adjoining park areas, according to Clyde A. Corman, Longview, congress president.

More than 2,000 delegates—boss loggers, king jacks, gypsos, contractors, foresters and just plain red-shirted timber beasts—will gather in Seattle from all over western North America for the four-day meeting.

Rae Johnson, woods superintendent for Columbia Cellulose Company, will be the only delegate from Prince Rupert. He and Mrs. Johnson left Wednesday for the U.S. city.

British Columbia will send 100 of its top loggers to the congress, headed by S. G. Smith and J. E. Liersch of Vancouver, members of the congress management committee.

Other British Columbians who will head up the Dominion's delegation include: Jack Baikie, Nanaimo; James Sheasgreen, Ladysmith; Norman English, William McMahan and Charles Durham, Vancouver, members of the board of directors.

Another group of British Columbians will take part in the panel discussions during the four days.

## BLACKWOOD on BRIDGE

Be Alert to Need for Unusual Plays

It is hard to find any fault with the holding of a hand like Mr. Abel's. However, when practically all of a partnership's strength is concentrated in one hand, a serious entry problem is often present.

When this is the case, declarer must be alert to the necessity of making out of the ordinary plays which will enable him to reach the weak hand.

In today's deal Mrs. Keen opened the deuce of hearts against the three no trump contract. Mr. Meek won with the ace and Mr. Abel dropped the trey. The six of clubs was returned and Mr. Abel decided to duck. Mrs. Keen won with the 10 and returned the queen.

The king won and Mr. Abel cashed the ace and king of diamonds. He next cashed the king of hearts and looked vainly for the jack to drop. When Mr. Meek showed out on the second heart lead, discarding the nine of diamonds, it was clear that the 10 of hearts would never be an entry to the board.

Mr. Abel now laid down the ace of clubs, stripping Mrs. Keen of that suit, and followed with the queen and another heart. Mrs. Keen was in on the last heart lead and her return was the 10 of spades. Although this gave Mr. Abel two spade tricks, he still had only eight tricks in all.

"Beautiful end-play for down one," said Mr. Champion sarcastically. "Anybody could enter my hand if I had an ace. I had an entry just as good as an ace."

but it took a little thinking to see it.

"All you had to do was to drop your queen of hearts under the ace at the first trick. That would leave you with two hearts smaller than my 10 spot and nothing could have prevented you from reaching the board to cash all of the diamonds."

This analysis was correct. But it isn't the "normal" play to drop a queen under an adverse ace when you can play the lowly trey.

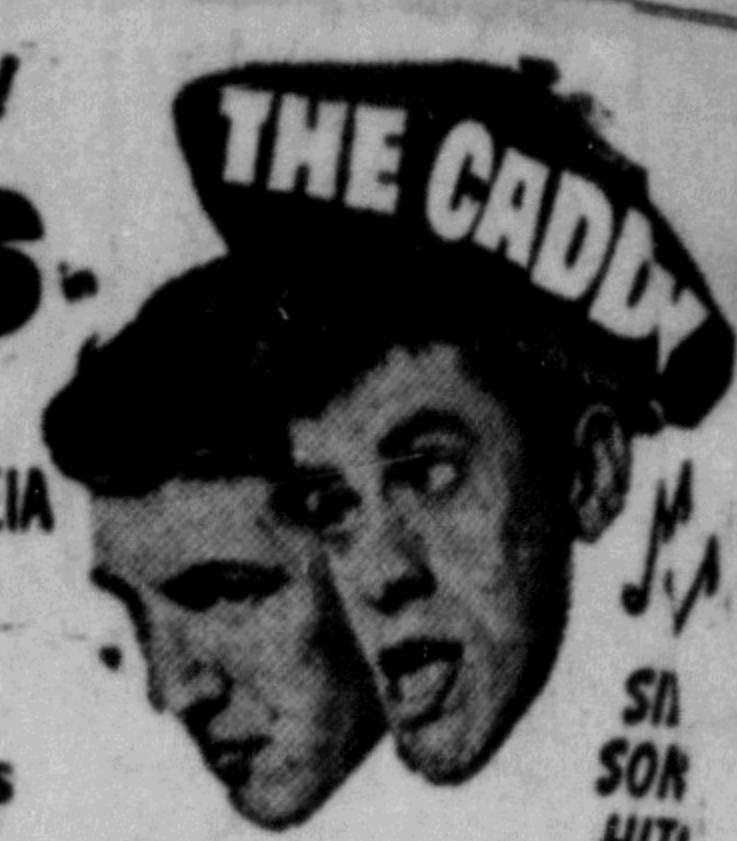
