

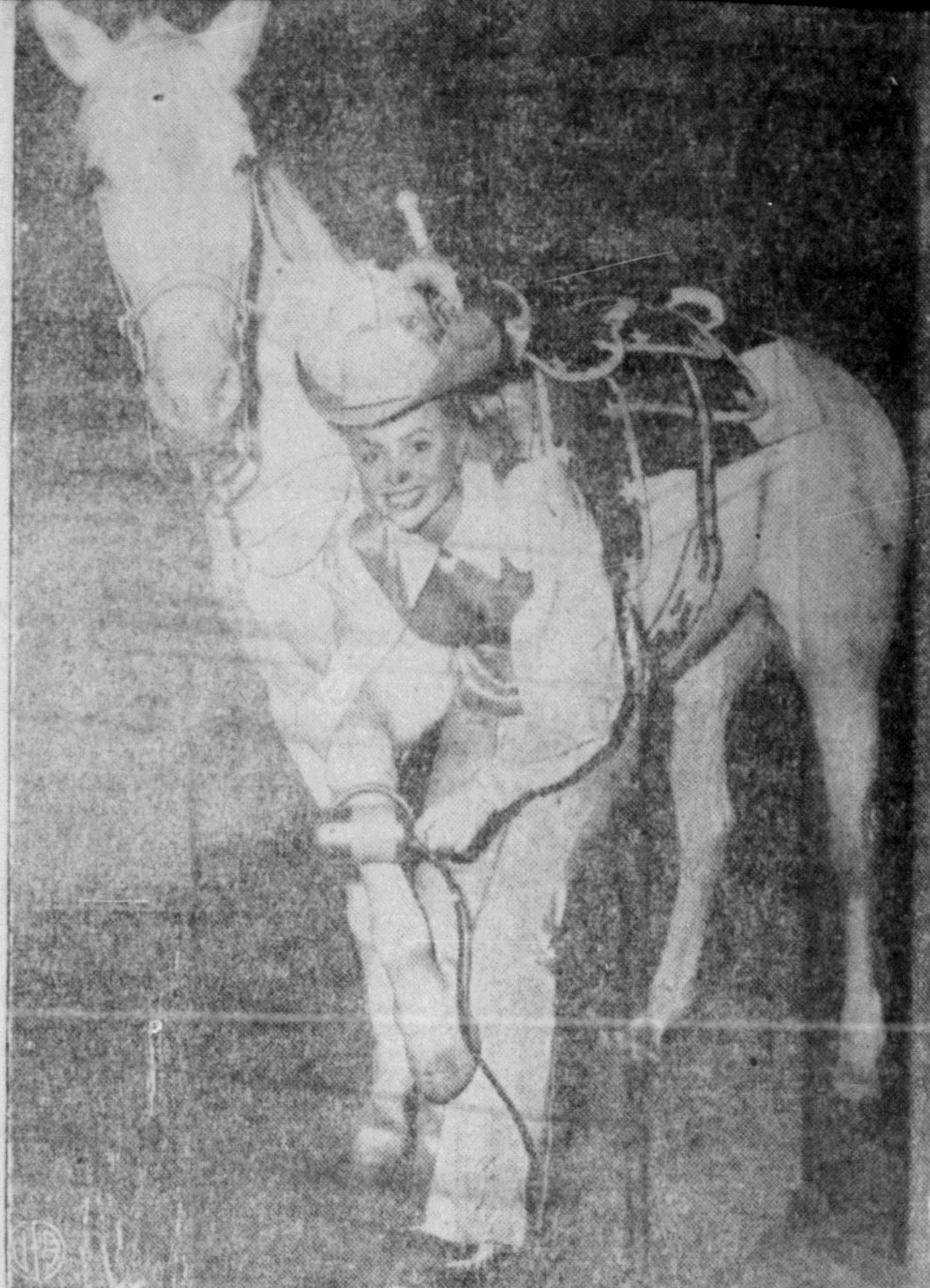

One of World's Last Surviving Wooden Ships Crippled, Helpless

BANGOR, Wales (Reuters)—The proud old Conway, leader of the fleet that rode to battle against the Russians 99 years ago, is being prepared for slow destruction at the hands of her oldest enemy—the sea. The 114-year-old heart-of-oak warship, on whose decks poet laureate John Masefield first felt sea fever stir, lies crippled and helpless on the rocky shore

of the nearby Menai Straits, where she went aground while under tow last April.

There is no hope that she can be saved. The primary concern now is to make her fast in her present position so she cannot heel over in the coming winter gales and menace other shipping in the narrow and tricky channel.

One of the world's last surviving wooden battleships, she was launched in 1839 as the Nile, a 92-gun ship of the line. Years later she was the pride of a British flotilla that kept the Russian Baltic fleet at bay off St. Petersburg in the Crimean war.

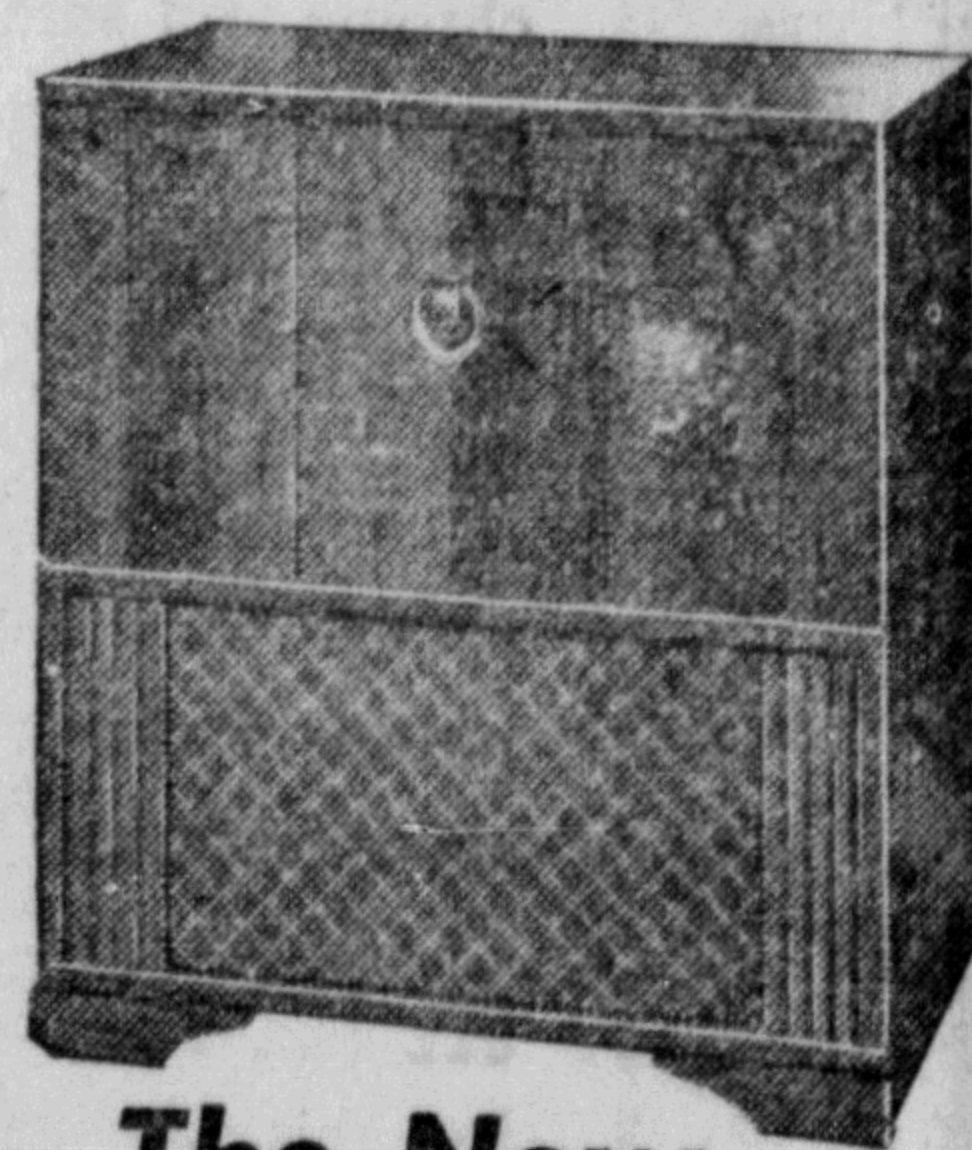
Later converted to steam, the 245-foot warship sailed the world's seas until 1875, when she was moved to the river Mersey to become the base of the British merchant marine's training school.

During the Second World War air raids the Conway was towed away from the target city of Liverpool to safer moorings off the Welsh coast. The aged vessel was still a training centre for 250 youths when her death blow struck unexpectedly last spring.

Howe Opposed to Government Lending Funds On Farm-Stored Grain to Western Farmers

WINNIPEG (CP)—Trade Minister Howe indicated this week he is opposed to the federal government "getting into the business of lending money on farm-stored grain" to western farmers faced with a glut of unsold wheat.

He said the producers received a greater measure of aid through the government's recently-announced decision to distribute \$100,000,000 in Wheat Board payments for 1952 western grain crops.

In a speech at the 26th annual meeting of the Manitoba Wheat Pool, the trade minister said farmers' requests for loans on the security of grain stored on farms were receiving "most careful consideration."

AVOID LOAN BUSINESS

"It does seem to me, however, that in the interests of all concerned, it would be better if we could avoid getting into the business of lending money on farm-stored grain."

Referring to the recent distribution of Wheat Board payments, Mr. Howe said:

"Nothing the government could have done to ease the

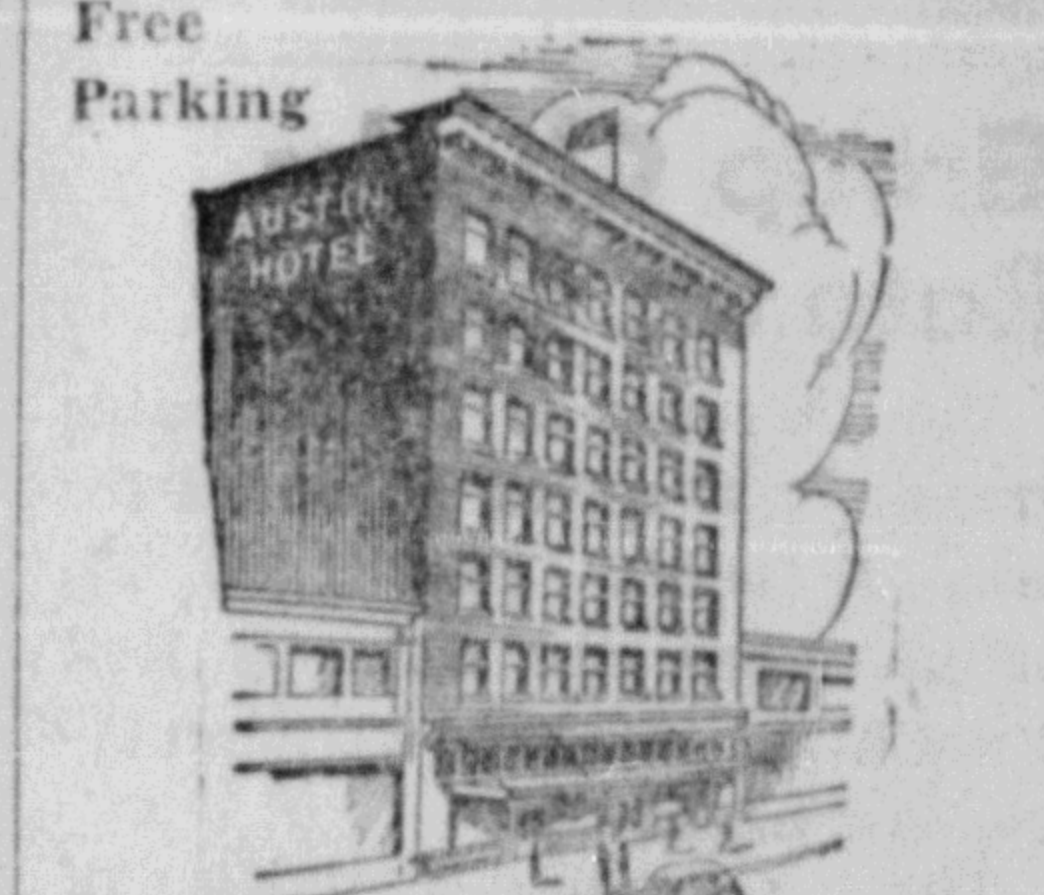
farmers' immediate financial position could possibly compare in importance with this early distribution of \$100,000,000 from the 1952 crop."

It was "unfortunate" that a decline in immediate export purchases of Canadian wheat coincided with the harvesting of the country's second-largest crop in history.

"Nevertheless, Canada is selling wheat, not as quickly as any

of us would wish, but steadily, and in increasing volume. We are getting our fair share of the wheat business of the world, which is all that we can expect to get."

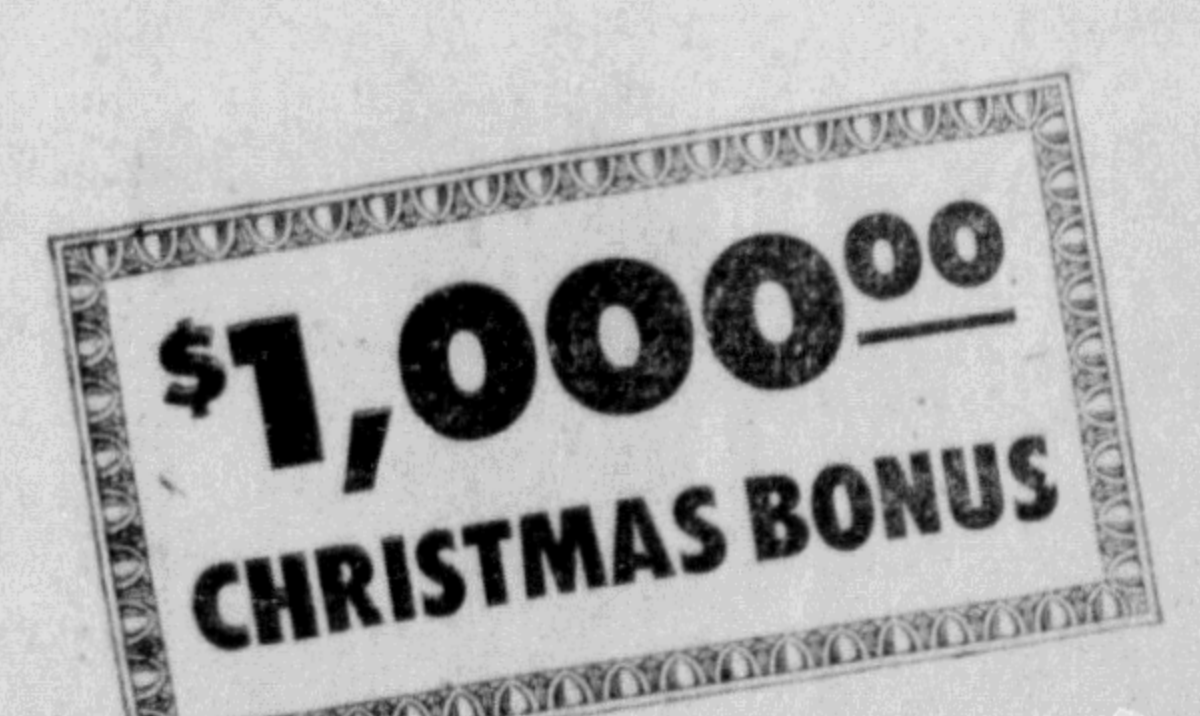
