

Big 3 Ready To Rebuke Israel for Killings

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y.—The western Big Three were reported ready today to urge a United Nations Security Council rebuke against Israel for the recent border killings in an adjoining Arab village and to call for more UN "watchdogs" in the troubled area.

Airline Competition 'Approved'

OTTAWA (CP)—Prime Minister St. Laurent predicted Wednesday night that Canada's economic development will give more scope for competition among airlines and indicated his government will not block such a trend.

He said the government is opposed to the "abuses" of competition where there is insufficient traffic for more than one operator, but added:

"The government does not necessarily intend to guarantee every operator a permanent monopoly in his area."

In a speech to airline executives and aircraft manufacturers, the prime minister discussed an application by Canadian Pacific Airlines to run a cross-country air cargo service between Montreal and Vancouver. Existing government policy has given the government-owned Trans-Canada Air Lines a monopoly in east-west trunk services.

The cabinet this week will hear representations from both CPA and TCA on the issue.

TWO PRINCIPLES

Mr. St. Laurent said the cabinet decision will be based on two principles: what is best for the public, "not just for a short period but indefinitely," and what is best for the industry itself.

"We will endeavor to determine whether there is enough business in sight for two lines to serve the public at reasonable rates and with reasonable profit," he told members of the Air Industries and Transportation Association, at a dinner ending their three-day annual meeting.

"Which ever way the decision goes now, it will not in the long run be a decision in favor of the perpetuation of monopoly conditions."

The government believed that as a general rule the public was best served under competitive conditions.

Abba S. Eban, Israeli chief delegate, also served notice that he intended to go over the whole Middle East security question before the council this afternoon. Eban accused the Arab states Wednesday night of continuing to keep up tension in Palestine.

Western sources said Britain, France and the United States would submit a resolution to the council this afternoon denouncing the armed Israeli raid on the Jordan village of Kibya, which cost 53 Arab lives. They said the resolution also would call for more truce supervisors in Palestine to guard the peace along the Arab-Jewish borders.

Dispatches from London said the Big Three also were considering asking for an automatic arms embargo against whichever side the council finds guilty of violating the truce agreements in the future.

ARAB PRAISE

The reported plan to increase the truce supervisors brought praise from the Arabs and sharp criticism from Israel.

Syria's Rafik Asha declared "anything that would lead to respect for the truce agreement would be welcome."

Eban said such a program would be "bereft of statesmanship and wisdom."
