Layoffs in Auto Industry Increase as Sales Shrink

TORONTO (CP)—The automobile salesman is on the offensive. Urgency is in his voice. Sales of new and used cars so far in 1954 are down from the volume of 1953—15 per cent, says a leading maker. "Layoff" is the ominous word around the auto plants.

Whatever the reason for hesitancy shown by the buying public—cold, wet weather is the announced cause in Winnipeg; just plain "hard to sell" is Toronto's admission—it is clear that the lush early post-war years on wheels that ran found a ready buyer.

Prices have been cut, particularly in Toronto where new cars of the leading popular makes can be obtained for as much as \$300 under list price. Reductions on higher-priced cars are greater.

Used-car lots are jammed. Prices are down from this time last year—\$200 on the average, a cross country survey shows. "Name your own down payment" is the slogan running through advertisements. A Regina dealer offers a set of golf clubs with every car.

Gimmicks employed by the dealers in a buyer's market are many and varied. "Up to \$895 worth of accessories free with every brand new 1954 car," announces a Toronto firm. Free radios, 100 gallons of gasoline or free seat covers are other inducements in this and other cities.

A total of 6,500 workers has been laid off by Ford Motor Company of Canada for varying periods. Of 2,500 laid off at Ford's Oakville, Ont., plant, 850 have been told that the layoff is indefinite.

OTHERS NOT IMMUNE Other companies have announced correspondingly severe layoffs and General Motors at Oshawa, Ont., while not yet ordering a shutdown, warns: "No company is entirely immune to industry-wide trends."

Labor leaders are angry. Charles McDonald, president of Ford Local 200 of the United Auto Workers of America (CIO-CCL) termed the Ford layoffs "more proof that the dog-eat-dog production race in the Canadian automobile industry has caught up with passenger car sales."

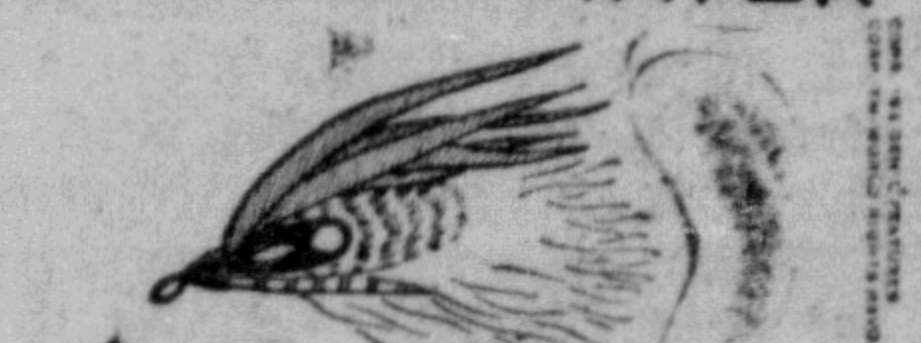
