Let Enemy Lead Dangerous Suit

Mr. Meek thought Miss Brash would never get through bidding in today's hand. He promised himself that if he ever got out of this, he would refuse to keep the bidding open on an ace and jack in the future.

As it happened, the final result was something less than a catastrophe as Mr. Meek made five hearts by a nice play.

The king of diamonds was opened and he won with dummy's ace. He saw that he could win 11 tricks if Mrs. Keen had both king and queen of spades or if she held the ten of spades and one higher honor.

It then occurred to him that if the outstanding trumps were divided 2-2, he could make his contract, even if both the king and queen of spades were in Mr. Abel's hand (provided the ten wasn't there, too). He planned to do this by the simple expedient of having the enemy lead spades for him.

But there was some important preliminary work to be done. At trick two, Mr. Meek led a low heart to the ace. He then led a club and cashed dummy's ace and king. He led back a small club and ruffed it with the ten of hearts.

Next came a low heart to dummy's king and both opponents followed suit. Dummy's last club was ruffed in the closed hand and it was now time to give the defense their diamond trick.

Mrs. Keen won the diamond lead with the ten. She looked for a safe return but there was none. If she led another diamond, Mr. Meek would discard the eight of spades from the board and ruff in his hand, thus holding his spade losers to one.

Mrs. Keen decided to return the ten of spades. But this was no good either. Mr. Meek played small from the board and Mr. Abel won with the queen. The defense was now dead. As before, a diamond lead would give Mr. Meek a sluff and a ruff. A spade return would go into dummy's ace-jack.

There are a thousand variations of this situation. The point to remember, of course, is that when you have a dangerous key suit, try to avoid leading it yourself. Let the enemy lead it. It will almost always cost them a trick.
