NEW YORK (AP) — Rocky Marciano is Ring Magazine's "fighter of the month" and Joe Walcott drops to No. 3 challenger in the heavyweight division in the new rankings.

Edward Charles, the ex-champion in Cincinnati, who is on a hot win streak, gets the No. 1 place behind Marciano, followed by Roland La Starza, of New York.
