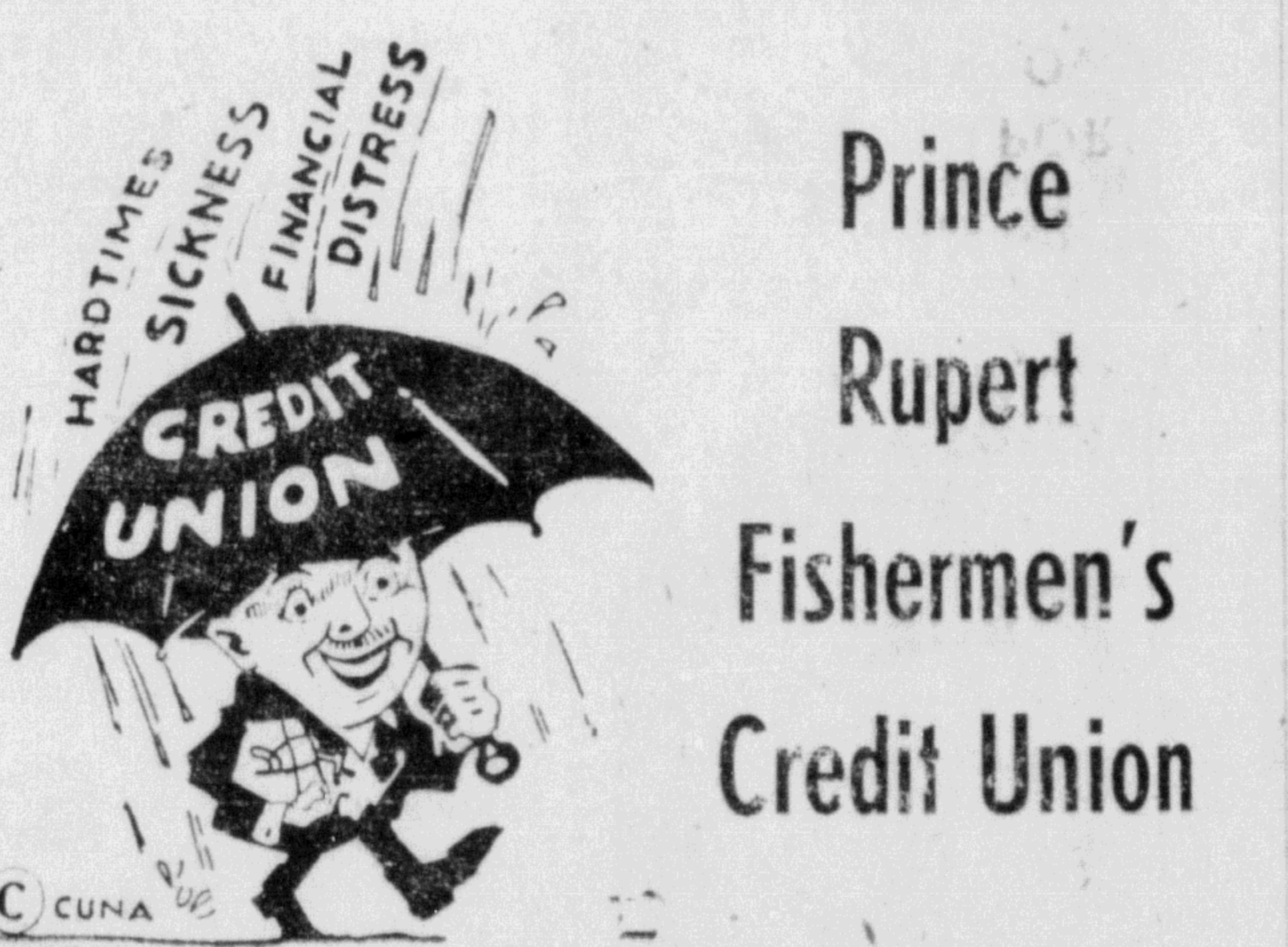

**Big Terrace
School Plan**

TERRACE — A building program to cost about \$421,000 is now being planned for trustees of Terrace School District.

A bylaw to finance this work is expected to be presented to ratepayers shortly.

Plans for the various units are now being prepared by the Vancouver architectural firm of Sharp & Thompson, Berwick, Pratt.

First portion, expected to be put under way this year, consists of work at the Terrace elementary school with an estimated cost of \$50,000. This will involve connecting the existing two buildings with a corridor on which three classrooms will be extended and adding and converting an army building to provide a further six classrooms.

The existing low pressure steam heating system will be enlarged. Second project hoped to go ahead this year is completely remodeling the high school here. A new roof and new hot water heating system will also be included in this project with a cost of about \$25,000.

The architects have now started on sketch plans on a new \$300,000 high school for Terrace which is scheduled to proceed next year.

Other items slated for 1953 include an \$18,000 one classroom addition to New Hazelton elementary school, new basements and heating systems in existing schools at Kitwanga and Usk at \$9000 apiece, and three new teacherages in the district.
