#### Weather May Increase U.S. Wheat Surplus

WASHINGTON A-If weather conditions for wheat are normal or better between now and harvest next summer. United States growers may add to a big wheat surplus rather than reduce it under a rigid production control program.

This possibility was indicated Monday by a U.S. agricultural department report estimating that farmers have cut their winter wheat acreage nearly 20 per cent, but that the crop volume may be down only about 14.7 per cent.

The report showed that it would be possible to produce a billion-bushel U.S. wheat crop next year. A harvest of this size would be about 50,000,000 bushels more than officials now expect the market to absorb from the 1954 crop.

Thus, the surplus, now forecast at a record of 775,000.000 bushels at the start of the 1954 marketing year, would be boosted to 825,000,000.

#### Yeggs Use Ton of Sugar

NEW YORK M-An undisclosed number of yeggs used a ton of granulated sugar some time during the week-end to whip up a \$7,000 cake at a Brooklyn bakery.

The "cake"-or \$7,000 in cash-was in a one-ton safe on a balcony 30 feet above the main floor. The recipe called for getting it down without

waking the neighborhood. Police said 20 bags of sugar, each weighing 100 pounds, were laid out as a cushion. The safe was then pushed off the balcony, taken to a loading platform and carted away.

Much of the granulated sugar was powdered in the process.
