"I don't mean to imply categorically that there can be no relationship whatever between smoking and lung cancer. But so far the reported increase in lung cancer cases has been statistical rather than clinical.

"Medical science has advanced tremendously in diagnosis, and cases established as lung cancer today were undoubtedly labelled something else a comparatively few years ago. Also, science now is giving closer study to lung cancer in relation to occupational diseases and to the increasing air pollution of our fast-growing industrial areas."

Mr. Wood said his company is taking no particular countermeasures to combat curren claims. There had been no effect on its sales. Publicity given the question had not brought any inquiry to the company from the public.

British Army May Be Given Guided Missiles

LONDON (Reuters) - Britain announced Wednesday her army may soon be equipped with atomic guided missiles for "pur-poses of offence."

War Minister Antony Head said the army is 'nearing a decision" on the introduction of the atomic weapons. Three days ago, Sir Winston Churchill's government announced it is equipping the RAF with atomic bombs from secret stores.

Britain exploded her first atomic weapon off the Australian coast Oct. 3, 1952, and further atomic tests were held on the Woomera rocket range in central Australia last October.

Head, in a statement to Parliament on army estimates for the 1954-55 year, said:

"We have given a great dealof thought to the defensive and offensive aspect of the introduction of atomic weapons. Defensively, training has gone ahead in various methods of protection and detection. Radiac (instruments for detection of radioactivity after an atomic explosion) are now in production, and training versions are already in the hands of troops.

"We are nearing a decision on the introduction of an effective army weapon of offence. This will probably take the form of a ground-to-ground mediumrange guided missile . . .

"All possible steps are being taken to insure that the introduction of atomic weapons will find the army well prepared in the offensive use and in methods of defence."

He said a three-day indoor exercise held near London last August and attended by representatives of all Commonwealth countries made "a close study of the problems of supply, com munication and movement un der atomic attack and also of the tactical and strategic use of atomic weapons."






