**Sons Facing Chilly Winter**

**SONS FACING** on page Seven NELSON, B.C. (CP)—Dread of approaching winter hangs over a Doukhobor tent town which has mushroomed in a hayfield in British Columbia's Slokan valley.

More than 200 Sons of Freedom with a common bond—all have lost their homes in incendiary fires—have deserted their local leaders and pitched tents on the government-owned property.

The community of homeless, with winter approaching, is seeking through prayer the return of the man it recognizes as spiritual leader—Stefan Sofoklin.

The Doukhobors began to gather in rain and darkness Thursday night near the village of Perry's Sliding. Week-end new tents appeared as the call went out for those left homeless by fire raids.
