Former Carnival Strip Teaser Held After Kidnapped Baby Found Alive

DURANT, Okla. (AP)—Federal Bureau of Investigation agents held in secret custody here today a 17-year-old former carnival strip teaser and the five-month-old baby boy they said she admitted kidnapping in Evansville, Ind., to replace her two children who died at birth. Agents arrested Mrs. Norma

Jean Doughty and recovered the baby, Richard Lee Stammer, alive. They were found at the home of Mrs. Doughty's father, Buford H. Mason, north of nearby Bokchito.

The arrest occurred only a few hours after Mrs. Doughty arrived in this area following her two-day flight with the baby through four states by hitch-hiking and bus rides.

Special FBI agent James C. Ellsworth reported the baby was placed immediately under a physician's care and appeared "to be none the worse for wear and tear."

Ellsworth also announced that the U.S. district attorney at Muskogee, Okla., has authorized that kidnapping charges be filed against the woman.

MOTHER BITTER

Mrs. Shirley Stammer, 18, was stunned when told at Evansville that the baby and his abductor

had been found. "We can just be thankful he's OK," she said. "I was awfully bitter against her, but not too bitter now."

The Stammers said they hadn't slept since their baby disappeared Friday night with the babysitter who lived across the hall from the apartment of Mrs. Stammers' mother.

Ellsworth reported Mrs. Doughty told him she "fell in love with the baby" immediately last Friday when his mother brought the child to his grandmother's to be cared for during the evening. She was hired as a babysitter for the occasion.

At Gainesville, Tex., police said the woman's husband, B. R. Doughty, is seeking an annulment of their marriage.

Although Mrs. Doughty said she took the child to replace two children of her own that she lost, Doughty said as far as he knew she had no children

It Shouldn't Happen to Mr. Champion

"This is ridiculous," said Mr. Champion savagely when he discovered the situation in the club suit. He meant that things like that shouldn't happen to him.

Mr. Muzzy had opened the trey of diamonds and Mr. Champion had won with the king. He then cashed the ace and queen of clubs. On the second club Mr. Muzzy showed out, dropping the trey of hearts.

As you see, the club suit was now blocked. If another club is led to the king, the high club is then in the closed hand—and there are no more entries to dummy.

If Mr. Champion leads the nine of clubs and ducks in dummy, Mrs. Keen will win with the jack and the defenders can then win four tricks in diamonds.

Well, when you don't have the entries you need to make your contract you can always try to enlist the aid of your opponents. Mr. Muzzy had led the trey of diamonds so it appeared he didn't have more than five cards in the suit. If he could be enticed into cashing his diamonds, the hand could still be made.

So at trick four Mr. Champion tossed out his six of diamonds. "Ridiculous is right," commented Mr. Muzzy, to whom it ap-

peared Mr. Champion had simply pulled the wrong card while intending to lead another club.

Mr. Muzzy co-operated beautifully. He won with the queen of diamonds and cashed the ace. On this last trick Mr. Champion discarded the eight of clubs. Although Mr. Muzzy won four diamond tricks in all, he was then through. Mr. Champion won the ensuing heart lead and since he had unblocked the club suit he was able to take nine tricks without difficulty.

Admittedly it was tough for Mr. Muzzy not to cash his diamonds but, if he had shifted to a heart after winning the second diamond lead, Mr. Champion's clubs would still have been blocked and the story would have had a different ending.

Second Fire Strikes GM Detroit Plant

DETROIT (AP)—Fire struck Sunday night at General Motors' automatic transmission division at Willow Run, where it was moved only a few weeks ago after a multi-million-dollar fire leveled GM's Livonia transmission plant.

Within an hour after first reports, plant protection men told state police the blaze had been brought under control.

State police said they had reports, however, that "some persons" were injured.

The plant is some 30 miles west of Detroit.

Estimates of loss from the Livonia fire Aug. 12 ranged from \$30,000,000 to \$60,000,000. That costly blaze, which took several lives, interrupted production of several lines of GM cars and also at Packard and Ford's Lincoln-Mercury division.

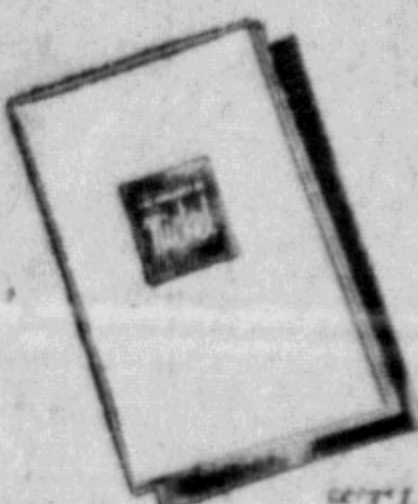
