New Indian Dept Doctor

Dr. Myron Lazarchuk, in his third year in Canada, has been appointed resident physician for the department of health here. Medical Superintendent of Milner Bay Hospital, Dr. J. D. Galbraith announced today.

Dr. Lazarchuk is expected to assume his new duties within a week, replacing Dr. L. P. Charman, former Federal Health Department physician who is leaving the practice of Drs. A. W. and R. G. Large here.

Both the newly appointed doctor and his wife are medical graduates of Vienna and arrived in Canada in 1948 from Poland that year came to Milner Bay hospital where they worked for one and a half years.

Since then, Dr. Lazarchuk has done considerable work for the department among Indians. Following completion of internship at St. Paul's Hospital, Vancouver, he wrote and passed his Canadian Council medical exams. Dr. Lazarchuk is currently writing similar exams.

Dr. Galbraith says the Lazarchuk team have made "remarkable" strides in measuring up to Canadian standards in medicine since their arrival here.
