BLACKWOOD on Bridge

Timing Your Hand Can Help You Cash winners

Timing a hand at bridge is simply arranging to cash your winners before the opposition can cash theirs. As an illustration, dream up a hand where you hold an eleven card suit, solid from the top and two worthless singletons. Opposite one singleton, dummy has worthless cards. Opposite the other, dummy has the ace and king.

Obviously you have 13 cold tricks... except for the irritating and inconvenient rule of the game whereby the defending side is given the first lead. The defenders will undoubtedly cash the ace of the suit in which you have nothing and, if you have bid a grand slam, you are done before you get started.

Of course, in the example given, no amount of skill in timing will help you. But there are many situations where declarer can help himself by timing his play in a certain manner.

Take today's hand, for instance. Mr. Muzzy won the opening spade lead with the king. Looking the hand over, it appeared to him he could give up two club tricks, then make three himself. These, added to two spades, three hearts and a diamond, would total nine.

"Relax, partner," he said to Mr. Champion. "The rubber is over."

Mr. Champion shuddered. At trick two Mr. Muzzy led a club to dummy's nine and lost to the king. Mr. Abel, who had played the jack of spades at the first trick, now returned the queen, knocking out Mr. Muzzy's last spade stopper. When in with the ace of clubs, Mr. Abel led his last spade. Mrs. Keen rattled off enough spades to put the contract down two.

It is not certain Mr. Muzzy could have made this hand at all, but his best chance was to go after the diamond suit at trick two. Here there was at worst a fighting chance of developing the suit with the loss of only one trick.

His best play was probably a low diamond toward dummy's ten. Either opponent could win and return a spade. After winning the second spade, Mr. Muzzy could go to the board with a heart, cash three tricks in that suit, then lead a diamond and finesse against the king. When the finesse worked, nine tricks would be cold.
