## Radio Officer Receives Award For Gallantry

LONDON (Reuters)—A radio officer who went down with his ship while sending SOS messages after the order "abandon ship," has been posthumously awarded the George Cross, Britain's highest award for civilian gallantry, it was announced Tuesday.

David Broadfoot was radio officer of the steamer Princess Victoria, which sank in a storm off the Irish coast Jan. 31, with the loss of 133 lives.

His citation, announced Tuesday in the London Gazette, said: "Thinking only of saving the lives of passengers and crew, radio officer Broadfoot remained in the radio cabin though he must have known that if he did this he had no chance of surviving."

Prince Rupert's first Christmas carol festival is now assured, according to spokesmen of the committee planning the project.

Six local choirs have promised to prepare carols for the festival and several others have indicated they probably will enter the program.

## Living Costs Jump Again In August

OTTAWA (C)—Living costs climbed again during August with the consumer price index jumping half a point to 116.2 from 115.7.

Higher food prices provided the main impetus. This was the fourth monthly increase in a row.

The index, based on 1949 prices equalling 100, now is just two points below the all-time high of 118.2 in December, 1951.

During August the price of many food items climbed including pork, eggs, coffee, lard, bread and butter.

The food column jumped by 1.2 points to 114.

The clothing column was unchanged at the peak of 110.4, but household operations climbed two-tenths of a point to a new high of 117.4. This column showed scattered increases for fuel.


