THE WATERFRONT

Closely interwoven with the city's history, the branch supply store here was opened in 1913 by the late Harry P. Lipsett and W. E. Drake, now president and general manager of Edward Lipsett Ltd-

Originally, the firm was founded by Edward Lipsett, born in Gloucester, Mass., who came west and established a sail loft in Vancouver in 1891. With arrival on the coast of the New England John Moser, manager of the fish Fish Company of Boston, now net division and Al van Snellen-Canadian Fishing Company Lim- berg, manager of the engine diited, Mr. Lipsett set up a supply depot for fishing boats.

This was the beginning of the first large scale commercial fishing venture on the B.C. coast.

Fishing in the early days, of Prince Rupert was mainly for halibut, with exception of a few salmon gillnetters on the Skeena and Naas Rivers. It was not until Nils Robinson began experiment ing in 1916 with a new type of trolling that the present method of commercial fishing was de veloped.
