

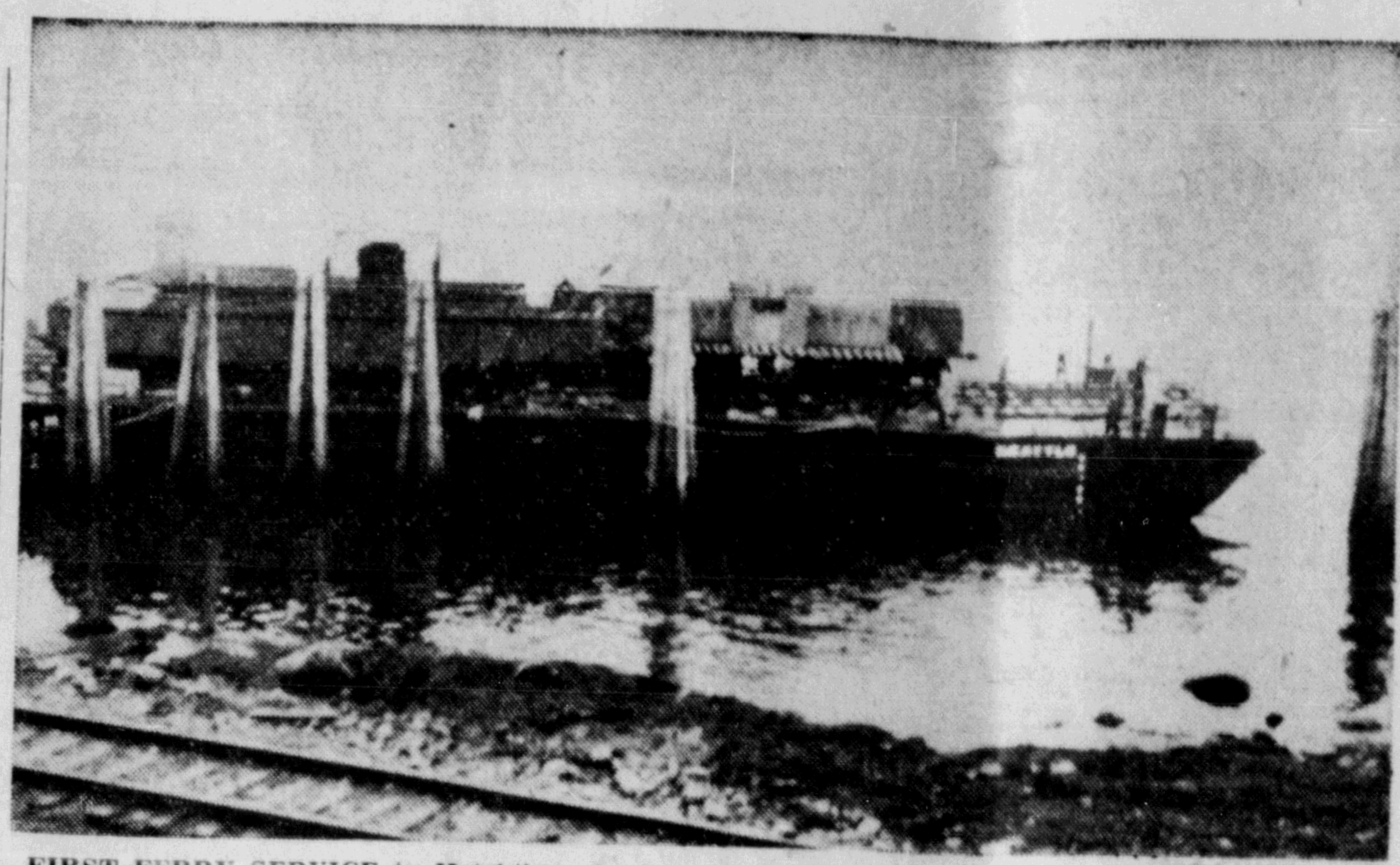

The new diesel "lokie" will be used in switching on the pulp mill's two miles of rail. The barge is seen just before leaving on its inaugural trip.

## On the Waterfront Rupert-Alaska Ferry Service Begins Bi-Weekly Operation

Second trip this week was started today by the Rupert-Ketchikan rail car barge ferry service inaugurated May 14 for shipping of supplies and equipment through Prince Rupert for the Ketchikan Pulp Company. The Dolly C, tug skippered by Capt. M. S. Cappelen, completes the round trip in three days. Four railroad cars loaded with the massive machinery are shipped each trip. The Alaska-B.C. Transportation Co. operates the ferry service from the slip provided here by the Canadian National Railways. The present set-up, however, is only temporary and a permanent 26-car barge service awaits completion of the barge and a permanent ferry slip on the waterfront here. Construction of the new slip will begin soon, say CNR officials. Meanwhile, in Ketchikan Mayor George Beck and his father conducted a welcoming ceremony as the first barge slipped into Ward Cove, site of the new pulp mill. Mayor Beck said a "new era in transportation and industry is now opened" and he foresaw an important lifeline opening through Prince Rupert. His father, 83-year-old Rev. George J. Beck, 58 years an Alaska Presbyterian missionary, said he had been dreaming of a pulp mill and ferry service for half a century. L. O. Gore, prominent in business circles, said studies are already underway for a public ferry slip in Ketchikan so the Rupert gateway can be used commercially. The Ward Cove slip will be used exclusively for pulp mill needs. The second of two outstanding freighters to enter the harbor this week arrived today. She is the Pasadena, registered in Copenhagen. Earlier this week, the Norwegian Reinsangr of the Westfall Larsen Line docked at the grain elevators for a cargo. Both ships are new and modern in design and equipped to handle passengers as well as general freight.

## Senators Slam at Yankees To Pummel League-Leaders

NEW YORK (AP)—Washington's fifth-place Senators made the aristocrats of baseball look like bush-leagueers Friday. The Nats, whose slugging attack hasn't frightened anybody this year or, for that matter, for many years past, hammered the mighty Allie Reynolds to the showers in one disastrous inning and pummeled his successors freely as they whipped New York Yankees 12-4. While the American League pace-setters committed two errors afield, Senators rubbed it in by ending the game with a triple play. Winner was Yankee cast-off Bob Porterfield, who pitched eight-hit ball and got two of his team's 13 safeties.
