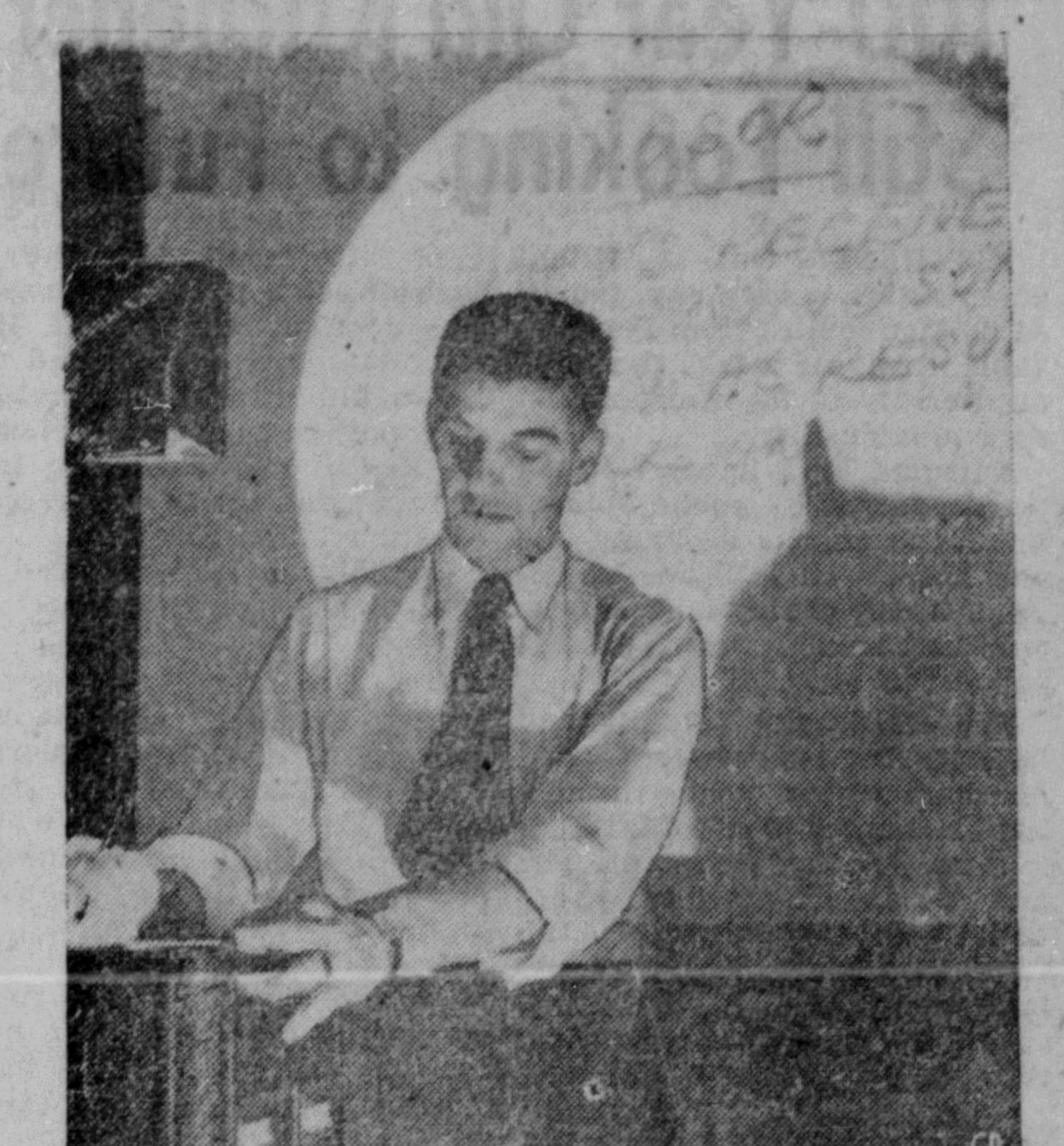

Fraser Appeal Dismissed

VANCOUVER (CP)—The British Columbia Court of Appeal Tuesday dismissed the appeal of Blair Fraser, Ottawa editor of Maclean's magazine, from an order striking out his defence to the libel action of Gordon S. Wismer.

Mr. Wismer, former attorney general of B.C., is seeking unstated damages from Fraser and Maclean Hunter Publishing Co. Ltd., for libel as a result of an article published in the Feb. 15, 1952, edition of the magazine entitled "B.C. Coalition Commits Suicide."

Tuesday's ruling was the latest development in the involved legal case that has not yet come to trial.

Mr. Fraser was appealing a decision of Mr. Justice A. D. Macfarlane of the B.C. Supreme Court striking out his defence arguments contending that the case should not go before the courts.

Mr. Justice Macfarlane based his decision on the grounds Mr. Fraser had refused to comply with a Supreme Court order that he disclose the sources of information on which he based his article.
