Indefinite Term For Sex Offender

VANCOUVER—In an unusual judgment for British Columbia courts, Mr. Justice J. F. Davey on Thursday sentenced a youth to an indeterminate term as a criminal sexual psychopath. Sentenced was Theodore Steele, 18, convicted of attempted rape of an 11-year-old girl. On this charge, he received a five-year sentence.

"I recommend that he be given proper psychiatric treatment and also treatment by a trained psychologist if that is necessary to give every chance of taking his place in society," said Mr. Justice Davey.
