Defender Discards Club Ace To Win 2 Trump Tricks and Set 4-Heart Contract

Mr. Masters discarded his ace of clubs to make sure he would win tricks with both the king and eight of hearts.

This sounds fantastic but it actually happened in today's deal. If it needs a bit of explanation, here's the way the play came up.

Mr. Masters opened the king of clubs which was ruffed on the board with the deuce of hearts. Mr. Champion correctly decided he had no chance for 10 tricks unless he could ruff all four of his losing clubs.

TRUMPED WITH ACE

Therefore at trick two he cashed the ace of diamonds, led a small diamond and ruffed it with the four of hearts. He led a second club and ruffed it, then came to his hand again with the ace of spades and ruffed a third club.

At this point the problem was how to get to the closed hand again. Mr. Champion decided it was plain silly to ruff another diamond low as Mr. Masters was almost certain to have the king of trumps. He could over-ruff and return a trump. This would take the last trump off the board and leave Mr. Champion with a closing club.

So a diamond was led from dummy and trumped with the ACE of hearts. Mr. Champion was willing to lose a trick to the king of trumps—but not now.

PARTNER COMES THROUGH

The last club was led and ruffed with dummy's last trump. Next came the 10 of spades and Masters was in with his queen. He returned the king of spades and Mr. Abel rose to unexpected heights as he often does when Mr. Masters is his partner.

He ruffed the good spade and led back a high diamond. At this point Mr. Champion was down to H Q J 6. Mr. Masters' last three cards were the ace of clubs and the king-eight of hearts.

Mr. Champion trumped the diamond with the jack of hearts. Mr. Masters made the fine decision not to over-trump. He simply threw away his ace of clubs. He then held king-eight of hearts over Mr. Champion's queen-six and was bound to win the last two tricks for the defeat of the contract.

Germany Would Recruit Army

BONN (CP)—The West German Bundestag Friday night approved Chancellor Konrad Adenauer's plan to recruit soldiers for western defence. But it added a string of conditions including an equal voice for Germans in the strategic councils of the west.

The vote was 204 to 156. Six deputies of the Bundestag, the lower house of parliament, abstained.
