"Dud" Rocket Kills Soldier
 FAIRBANKS, Alaska (AP)—One serviceman was killed, another lost both legs and five other persons were injured seriously in two separate accidents involving dud bazooka rockets at Galena, Alaska, the Air Force has announced.
 The first accident occurred on Saturday when three children entered an old bazooka firing range area. They picked up a dud rocket and threw it against stationary objects until it exploded.
 Four Air Force men were sent to the range Monday to post additional warning signs around the abandoned range.

After completing their work, one of the men located another dud rocket in the snow and took it back with him to the work party's vehicle. The three-quarter-ton weapons carrier had just started back to the base when the man dropped the rocket. It exploded, injuring all four men seriously. One man died later.

ASHDOWN FOREST, England (CP)—More than 1,400 acres of undergrowth and timber were destroyed by two fires in this Surrey area. Previously game wardens reported only two red deer—both female—were left in the historic forest.
