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SEALED TENDERS, endorsed "Tender for Alterations and Additions to Court House, Williams Lake, B.C.," will be received by the Minister of Public Works, Parliament Buildings, Victoria, B.C., up to 12 o'clock noon on Wednesday, the 30th day of June, 1954, and opened in public at that time and place.
Plans, specifications, and conditions of tender may be obtained on and after June 10th, 1954, from the Department of Public Works, Victoria, B.C., or Government Agent, Williams Lake, B.C., on deposit of the sum of Five Dollars (\$5) for each set, which will be refunded upon return of plans, etc., in good condition within a period of one month of receipt of tenders, except in the case of the successful tenderer where the plan deposit is not refundable. Plans and specifications will also be on view at the offices of Government Agent, Court House, Williams Lake, B.C.
Each tender must be accompanied by an accepted bank cheque on a chartered bank of Canada, made payable to the Minister of Public Works, for the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300), which shall be forfeited if the party tendering declines to enter into the contract when called upon to do so.
Tenders must be made out on the forms supplied, signed with the actual signature of the tenderer, and enclosed in the envelope furnished. No tender will be considered having any qualifying clauses whatsoever, and the lowest or any tender not necessarily accepted.
