Mayor Against Wage Increases

VANCOUVER (CP)- Decision of city council to freeze city workers' wages at 1952 levels is part of a campaign to hold the tax rate level or lower it, Mayor Fred Hume said.

"We are not going to grant wage increases, whether they be for two cents or \$10," he said. Last year assessments jumped 10 per cent and the tax rate one mill to 58 mills. Some 1,400 outside workers have asked for a 15-cents-an-hour wage increase.

SLIDE? HOW FAR?

The farther out you slide in delivering a rock, the greater you run the risk of drifting off the line of delivery. Let me recall again the imaginary line from the top of the backswing to the broom at the other end of the ice, at which you are aiming. A slider goes anywhere from 5 feet to 40 feet along this imaginary line before he releases the handle of the stone. Doesn't it seem reasonable then, that the farther you slide the more danger there is of getting off the line? And every time you get off the line you will have broom trouble. It matters not how far you slide AFTER you release the handle, because you can do no harm to the path the rock has taken but you can do a lot of damage to a good backswing between the time the stone hits the ice on the forward swing and the time you release the handle.

It is during this period that two things can happen to get your stone off line:

- (1) In sliding, your body may drift to the right, and because you have a hold on the handle, the stone is pulled off line too.
- (2) In releasing the handle, if you give it a twist or push you may alter the direction of the stone.

The simplest solution to avoid all these diseases is to swing the stone at the broom, release the handle in the same motion, then follow through with a slide after the rock is on its way.

A long slider is in for a lot of trouble unless he has exceptional balance and good rudder control with his right foot to keep his body directly in line behind his stone during the entire course of delivery. In my own case, my rock in delivery usually touches the ice just behind the 12-foot ring, and the handle is released, depending on the ice surface, between the tee-line and the front ring.

BLACKWOOD on Bridge

Mr. Muzzy Doesn't Use Balance of Power Wisely

After only one round of bidding, a player like Mr. Masters usually knows which side has the balance of power. This is an ability which Mr. Muzzy does not possess. When he has a good hand, as in today's deal, he fights to the bitter end. And, in many cases, the end is bitter indeed.

This refusal to let the opponents play a harmless under-game contract is a common error and it is hard to understand. When there are definite clues that the enemy has the edge in high cards, what can be gained by continuing the auction?

In today's deal Mr. Muzzy had a fine hand. However, his partner had shown no indication of strength while both of his opponents had.

Did he think there was game in the East-West cards? Of course, a hand could be constructed where that would be possible. But certainly the odds were overwhelmingly against it. Was he trying to force his opponents one notch higher where, it may be assumed, he thought he could set them a trick?
