 Tax Proposals**

VANCOUVER (CP)—The ex-
 ecutive of the Union of B.C.
 Municipalities may protest gov-
 ernment action in by-passing a
 proposal on the provincial so-
 cial services tax to finance edu-
 cation.
 The UBCM had suggested an
 80-20 split with 20 per cent of
 the receipts from the social se-
 curities tax going to municipali-
 ties.

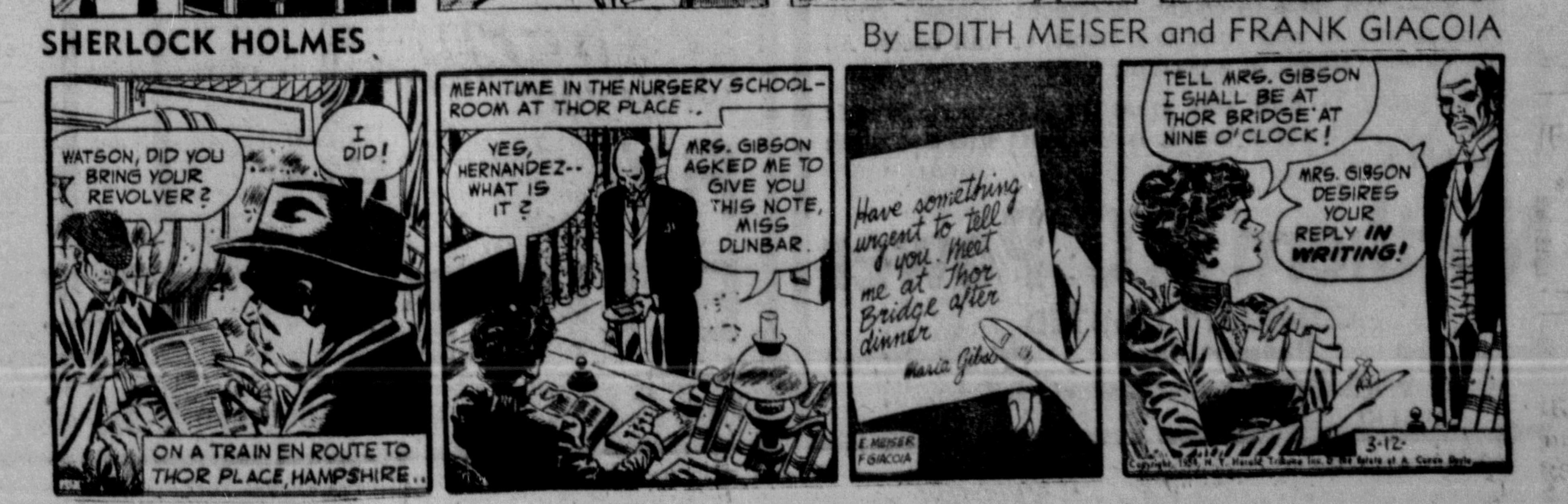
