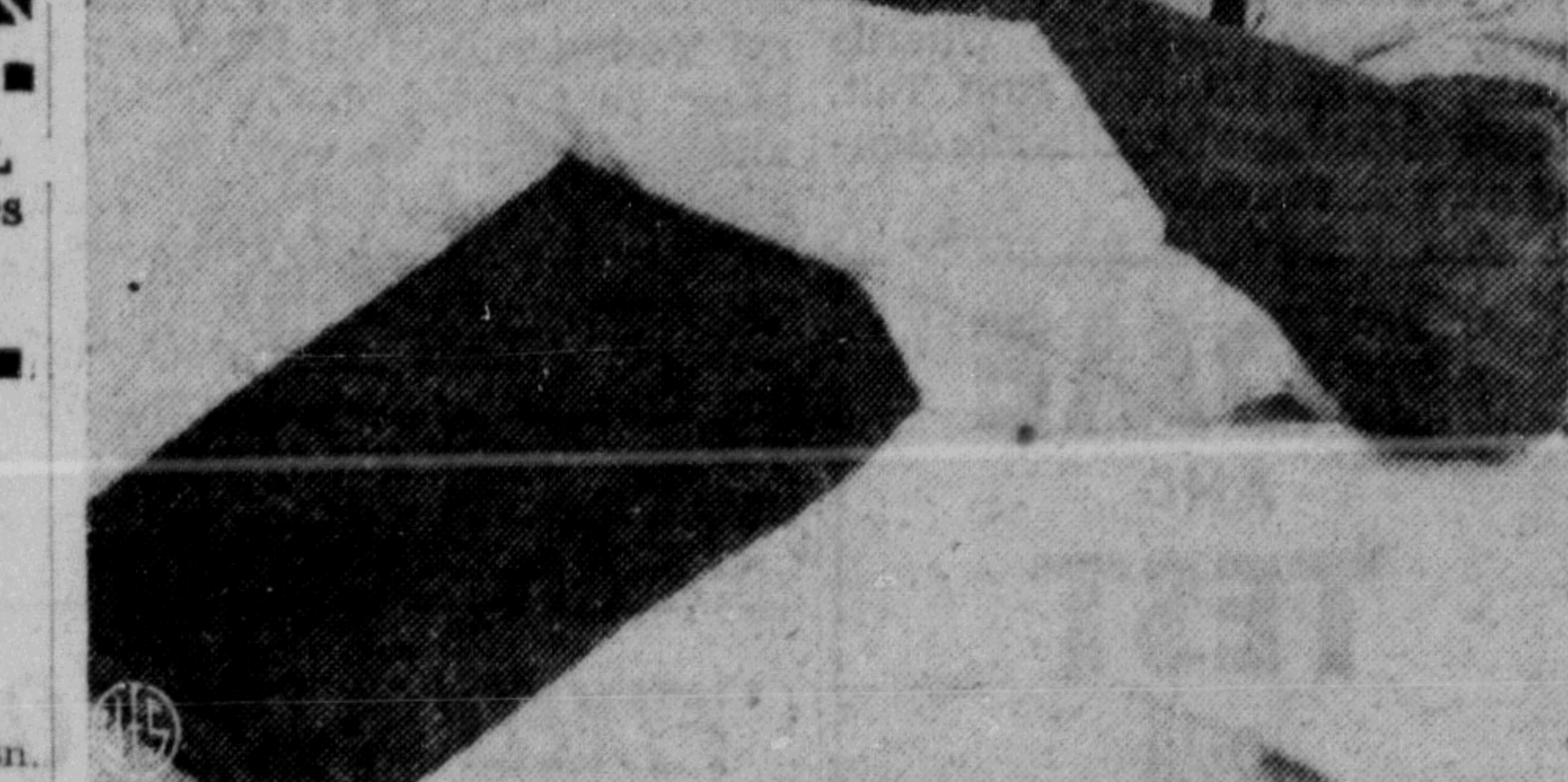

"Go to Canada" Club Formed By United Kingdom Emigrants

MONTREAL (C) - When Mr. and Mrs. Frederick Coupland of Nottingham, England, decided to emigrate to Canada last year they wanted company. So they formed a club.

The Couplands arrived in Montreal with their two children and 10 charter members of the "Go-to-Canada-together" club. And waiting to hear how the experiment works out are 80 more club members back home.

The idea got its start when the Couplands met Canadian airmen at North Luffenham.

"They were a friendly crowd and persuaded us that Canada was the best place to go," said Mrs. Coupland. "But we decided that it would be a lot easier to tackle a strange country and its unfamiliar customs in a group."

"After thinking it over, we decided we should form a club of all those in our city and district who were interested in going to Canada. We advertised and held our first meeting in a school. Forty people came.

"After that we got more and more. When we left, the club had a membership of 80."

Chicago Man Heads Rotary International

SEATTLE, Wash.-Herbert J. Taylor of Chicago was elected president of Rotary International for 1954-55 at the 45th annual convention of that world-wide service club organization, which completed its five-day session here yesterday.

The convention registration of more than 8,000 Rotarians and guests represented 8,200 Rotary Clubs with a membership of 387,000 business and professional executives in 89 countries.

Mr. Taylor is chairman of the Board of the Club Aluminum Products Company and a director of a number of banking, civic and manufacturing organizations. He was vice-chairman of the U.S. War Department Price Adjustment Board in Washington, D.C., during World War two and is a past director of the American Management Association and of the Aluminum Wares Association. A Rotarian since 1923, he has served Rotary International as vice-president, director, district governor and as committee chairman and member. He is the author of the "Four-Way Test," a means for the evaluation of policies which has been widely adopted by business and professional executives, government officials and educators in many parts of the world.

Elected to Rotary International's Board of Directors were Rotarians from Australia, Belgium, Canada and the U.S.A.
