Fleet Quits Grand Bank

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld. (P) — Newfoundland's salt cod fishermen have quit the Grand Bank. For the first time in 80 years not one Newfoundland ship is on the bank.

Six small vessels now plying up and down the long reaches of the famed fishing grounds are all under Nova Scotia registry.

The Newfoundland fleet was not expected to die this year. One skipper was fitting out his boat but decided Friday to put his vessel on coastal trade, thus ending, at least temporarily, Newfoundland's part in the Grand Bank salt fish industry.

Instead, modern druggers are catching and storing cod, which is sold faster as fresh fillets.

Stevens Asks For Resignation Of LCB Head

VANCOUVER (P) — Hon. H. H. Stevens, chairman of the 1952 liquor survey in B.C., Friday called for removal of provincial liquor control board chairman Col. Don McGugan and his replacement by a three-man commission.

"I am disappointed that the government has seen fit to continue the old administration," Mr. Stevens said in an interview.

"I have no faith in the present administration either as a one-man commission or as an individual."

His remarks followed strong criticism here by cabaret and restaurant operators of Col. McGugan's proposals for implementing the new liquor act.

VANCOUVER (P) — The federal fisheries department has disclosed plans to build a \$5,500 fishway on the Kajusdis River which empties into Gunboat Passage, four miles east of Bella Coola.

The department said the river is a notable producer of coho salmon but even better production will be realized with the fishway to assist salmon over 14-foot high falls to the spawning streams.

Work starts in June.
