#### COMMONWEALTH NETWORK

The London-South Africa route will be the first leg in a Comet Commonwealth network. It is planned to introduce Comets on the London-Singapore service, via Pakistan and India, later this year.

A more powerfully-engined version fitted with Rolls-Royce Avon jets will subsequently be used to extend the service from London to Australia and New Zealand. The type of Comet should be capable of covering the 11,000 miles between London and Australia in about two




