**Expert Declares Flying Saucers Are Real Puzzle**  
TORONTO (CP)—Most reports of "flying saucers" can be explained as natural phenomena—but there still remains "a concrete group of reports that are unexplained."

This is the cautious assessment by Dr. Peter Millman, chief of the Dominion Observatory's astro-physics division at Ottawa.

"It is difficult to dismiss casually the weight of evidence that now has accumulated," he wrote in an article for the Toronto Telegram. "It is also a mistake to ridicule anyone making a sincere report."

He felt that 99 per cent of those who have reported seeing flying saucers were "perfectly honest" although they might have misinterpreted what they saw, "or wax a little over-enthusiastic in describing an event."

Dr. Millman said he had no "inside information" on flying saucers but for 20 years he has studied reports of objects seen in the sky during observations of meteors.

**ACCOUNTS VERY SIMILAR**  
The saucers had usually been described as disc-shaped or cigar-shaped. A few observers

claimed to have seen rows of lights or portholes along the sides. Nearly all reports said the objects moved rapidly and were highly manoeuvrable.

Many normal phenomena in the sky had given rise to flying saucer reports, he said. These included aircraft, balloons, meteors, planets, northern lights, reflections and mirages.

All of these can "under special circumstances appear in such an unusual way that the observer is sure he has seen a unique and inexplicable event."

After allowing for human error and eliminating sightings explainable at natural phenomena, however, "there still remains a concrete group of reports that are unexplained."

"One, two or three of these might be disregarded but there now seems to be too many peculiar cases to eliminate in this way."

"Personally I haven't come to any definite conclusions about these objects. . . I am awaiting further developments with interest. There seems to be a good deal that has not yet been satisfactorily explained."

## Britain to Start Jet Run May 2

LONDON (Reuters) — The speed of air travel will be stepped up by hundreds of miles an hour next month when Britain starts the world's first regular passenger service by jet airliner.

Record-breaking Comets of the British Overseas Airways Corporation will begin flights May 2 from London to Johannesburg, South Africa, which will cut many hours off the present travel time by conventional aircraft.

The 36-passenger DeHavilland Comets, which cruise at just under 500 miles an hour at a height of between 35,000 and 40,000 feet will take 23 hours and 40 minutes, including five stops on the way, to do the trip between the two cities, 6724 miles apart.

This compared with about 32 hours by conventional airliners. Actual flying time of the Comets will be 18 hours, 40 minutes, compared with about 27 hours at present.

The Comet service will operate on the South Africa "Springbok" route—the south east coast of Africa through Khartoum, in the Sudan.

During May there will be one Comet flight a week in each direction, leaving London on Fridays and Johannesburg Mondays. This will be increased to three a week in June, subject to deliveries of Comets to the airline.

Built by the DeHavilland Aircraft Company, the planes are powered by four "Ghost" jet engines similar to those used in many fast fighter aircraft.

**COMMONWEALTH NETWORK**  
The London-South Africa route will be the first leg in a Comet Commonwealth network. It is planned to introduce Comets on the London-Singapore service, via Pakistan and India, later this year.

A more powerfully-engined version fitted with Rolls-Royce Avon jets will subsequently be used to extend the service from London to Australia and New Zealand. The type of Comet should be capable of covering the 11,000 miles between London and Australia in about two days.

Somewhat faster than the Ghost-engined version, it can do a non-stop flight of 2250 miles with full load. In about two years' time, it is likely to

be operating on the North Atlantic and other routes.

Although a British airline will be the first in the world to operate a passenger jetliner service, other airways operations throughout the world will soon be using Comets. They include Canadian Pacific Airways, Commonwealth Pacific Airlines, Air France, and Union Maritime de Transport de France.

BOAC is to have the first 20 DeHavilland Comets, nine powered with "Ghosts" and 11 with the Rolls-Royce Avon jets.
