Cairo State Emergency

CAIRO (CP)—Authorities have proclaimed a state of emergency in Cairo as feelings mounted steadily higher with a fresh report of overnight clashes between Egyptian liberation fighters and British troops in the Suez Canal Zone.

The emergency decree was issued to "preserve public security" aimed at controlling bands of youths who have patrolled streets here recently, forcing bars and restaurants to close in sympathy with Egyptian deaths in the Suez area.

Reports circulated say Egypt has taken a new step to boost trade with Russia and other

Communist countries. Reports also say Egypt is ready to sell her precious cotton to Communist nations, reducing her trade with English cotton mills.

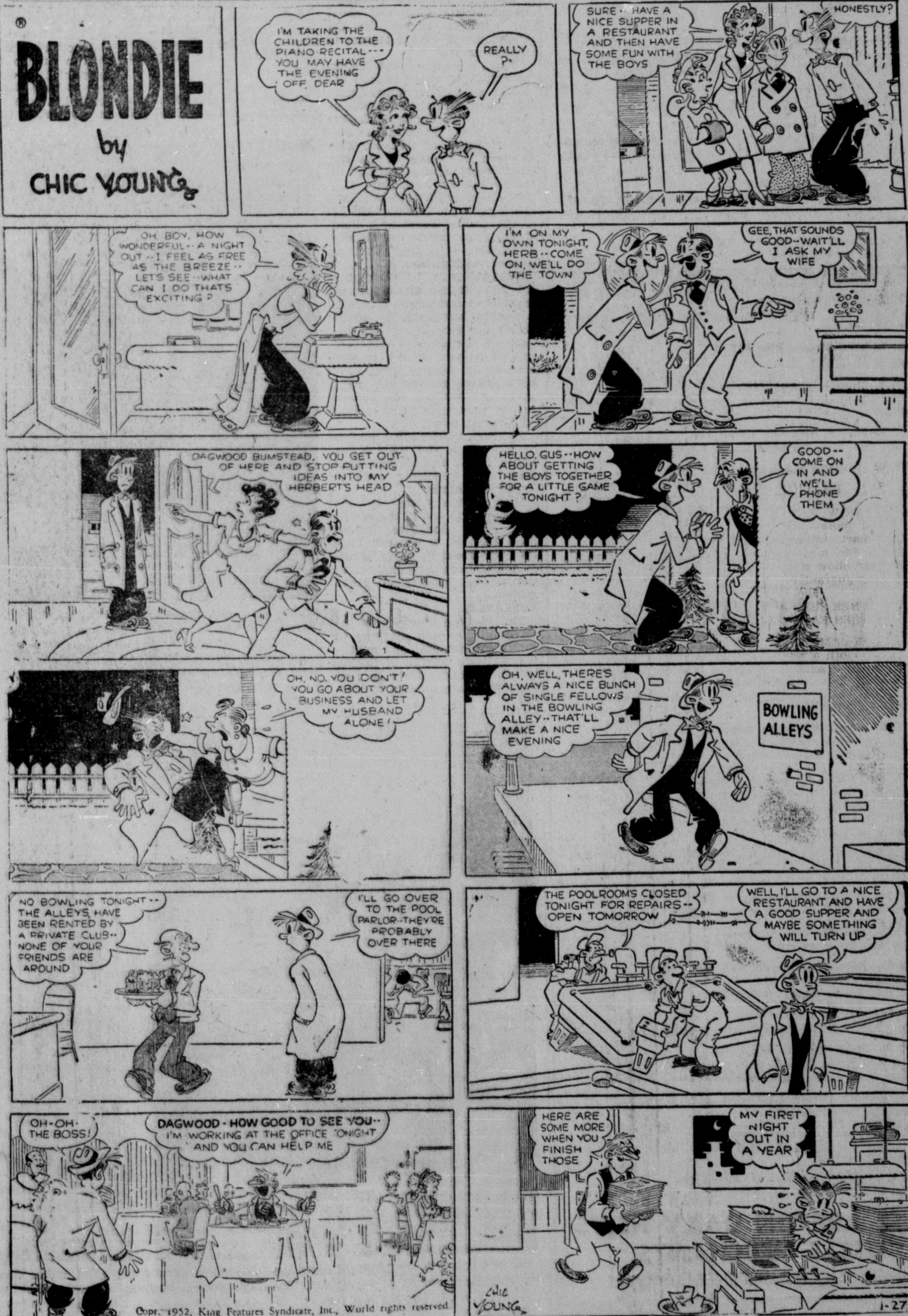
