

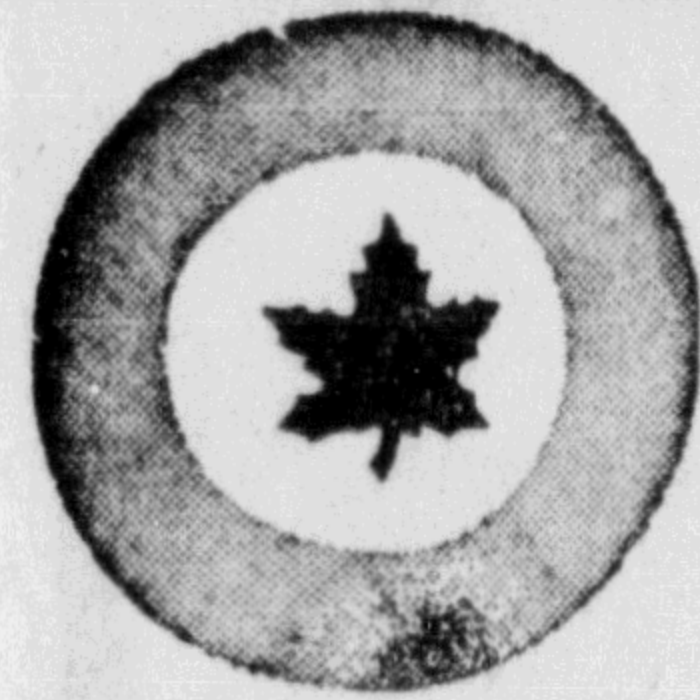
### Three-D mensional Films Boring

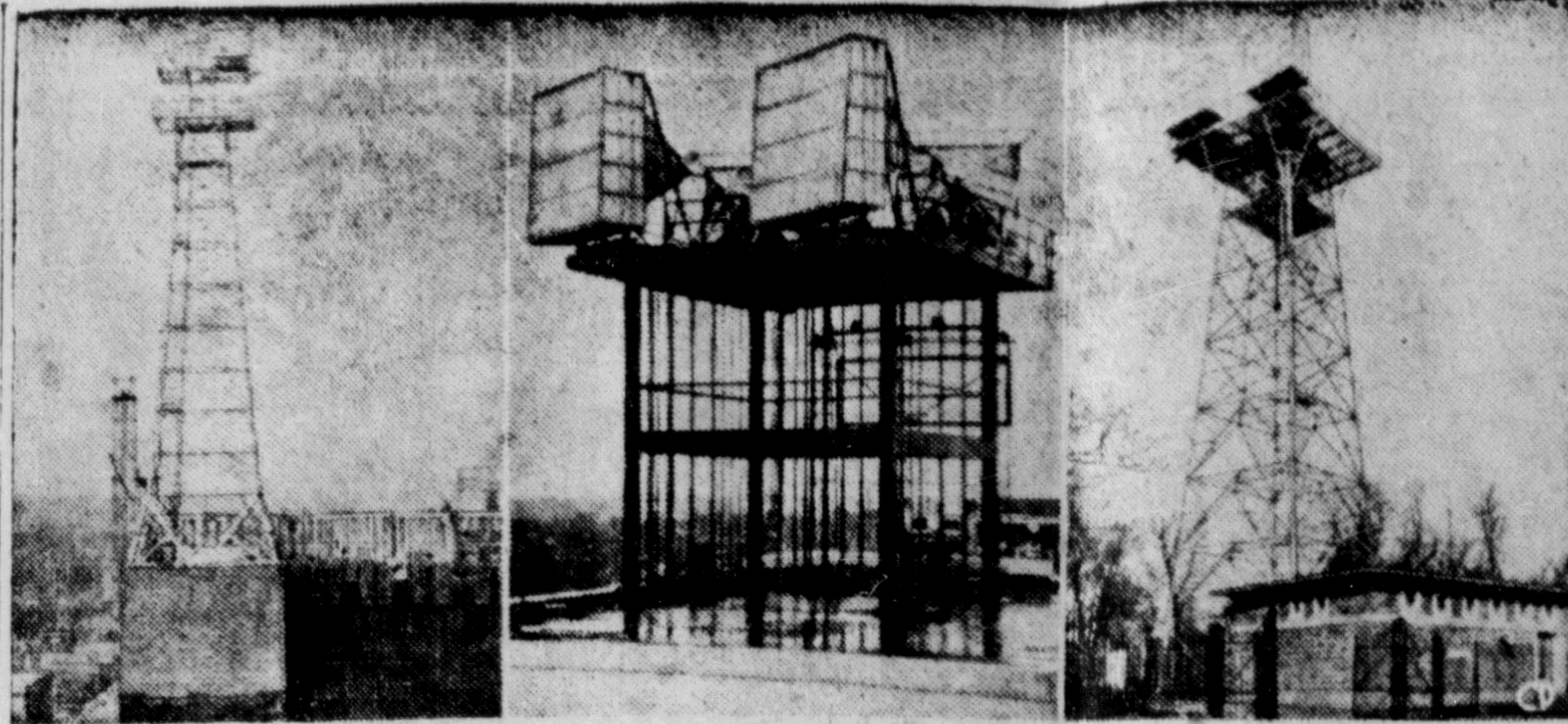

### Edinburgh Scot Takes Over As Pipe Major of RCAF Band

LONDON (CP)—A 32-year-old pipe major from Edinburgh has taken over the RCAF's pipe and drum band at North Luffenham. Sgt. John McKenzie, from a line of pipers dating to the days when the pibroch first sounded across the Scottish moors, now gives lessons in the craft to air-men such as Sgt. Stan Bendle of Toronto, LAC. Campbell McNeil of Sydney Mines, N.S., and LAC. Jay Henderson of Victoria. Formerly in the Scots Guards, whose red and black Royal Stewart he has exchanged for RCAF

blue, McKenzie brought his own pipes to No. 1 fighter wing, where the RCAF pipe band was formed about a year ago under a former Glasgow police band piper. The 30-piece, volunteer band will have its first real test May 30, when it will compete in the Caledonian games at London's White City Stadium. McKenzie has never visited Canada. His only link so far is a sister-in-law, Mrs. P. Shanahan, who lives in Toronto. But the husky Highlander hopes ultimately to take his wife and 11-month-old daughter to Canada. After 17 years of playing the pipes—he was taught by famous Willie Ross at Dunblane Academy — that new RCAF pipe major says there's only one way to learn. "Start young when your fingers are supple, and keep at it," he says. "You don't necessarily have to be a Scotsman."

### Young Veteran Appointed Naguib's Aide

CAIRO (Reuters) — Lt.-Col. Gamal Abdel Nasser, a young, strapping six-footer who looks like a movie star has been appointed to the No. 2 role in the Egyptian administration.

His appointment as vice-president of the 13-man military junta revolutionary council, the country's controlling body, confirmed his position as the right-hand man of Prime Minister Mohammed Naguib, president of the council.

In recent weeks, Nasser has presided over the daily meetings of the council when Naguib could not be present, and has come to be regarded as the top policy-maker in Egypt's military administration.

Nasser, a modest man of 35, wields vast power in the fast-moving regime of the new Egypt. From the beginning of Naguib's coup d'etat last July it was clear that Nasser, in his quiet way, was the strong man of Egypt's military regime.

When the coup leaders vacillated on whether to shoot, imprison or exile Farouk, it was Nasser who largely influenced the decision to spare the pudgy monarch's life. His reason: "History will sentence him to death."

Now, nearly a year after the coup, Nasser is the right-hand man of the premier. But, unlike Naguib, Nasser's power is directed from behind the scenes. He rarely makes public appearances.

Before Naguib came to power, Nasser's career showed no spectacular development. But he learned much about military affairs, particularly during the Second World War when he was attached to the British forces in the western desert of Africa.

### Senator Warns Against Tariff Tension

TACOMA, Wash. (AP) — A Canadian Senator warned the United States at a conference of the Pacific Northwest Trade Association here that neither his country nor its neighbor could afford to risk threatened tension over tariffs.

Senator J. G. Turgeon of Ottawa said he was concerned about import restrictions, particularly on agricultural products, that might threaten the good relations of the two countries.

"Unfortunately," he said, "already many strong statements have been made in Canada. There have been threats of retaliation. Those threats have been made by members of Parliament, not by the government, but they are serious in any case."

The speaker, for a number of years a Canadian representative in the United Nations, said some Canadian legislators wanted to place export restrictions on nickel and asbestos in retaliation. Canada is the chief source of both products, he said.

Another speaker, William H. Brown, secretary-treasurer of the American Viscose Corp., suggested that Alaska could get valuable lessons from Canada on how to attract investment capital.

He emphasized liberal tax treatment and sources of accurate information as strong points in Canada.

American Viscose is an investor in the \$40,000,000 pulp plant at Ketchikan.

### In the Black

CORNWALL, Ont. (CP)—Mayor Aaron Horowitz remarked "it's not much, but at least it's not a deficit," when the auditors' statement revealed the city of Cornwall had a net surplus of slightly more than \$3,000 in 1952. Operating surplus actually was about \$14,000 but somewhat more than \$10,000 was needed for cost of reassessment.
