#### Young Veteran Appointed Naguib's Aide

CAIRO (Reuters) - Lt.-Col. Gamal Abdel Nasser, a young, strapping six-footer who looks like a movie star has been appointed to the No. 2 sole in the Egyptian administration.

His appointment as vice-president of the 13-man military junta revolutionary council, the country's controlling body, confirmed his position as the righthand man of Prime Minister Mohammed Naguib, president of the council.

In recent weeks, Nasser has presided over the daily meetings of the council when Naguib could not be present, and has come to be regarded as the top policy maker in Egypt's military administration.

Nasser, a modest man of 35, wields vast power in the fastmoving regime of the new Egypt. From the beginning of Naguib's coup d'etat last July it was clear that Nasser, in his quiet way, was the strong man

of Egypt's military regime. When the coup leaders vacillated on whether to shoot, imprison or exile Farouk, it was Nasser who largely influenced the decision to spare the pudgy monarch's life. His reason: "His-

tory will sentence him to death." Now, nearly a year after the coup. Nasser is the right-hand man of the premier. But, unlike Naguib, Nasser's power is directed from behind the scenes. He

rarely makes public appearances. Before Naguib came to power, Nasser's career showed no spectacular development. But he learned much about military affairs, particularly during the Second World War when he was attached to the British forces in the western desert of Africa.

#### Senator Warns Against **Tariff Tension**


