U.S. Army Uses Blood Plasma Substitute

United States Army will hencemade from sugar, instead of blood plasma for all requirements at home and overseas.

An authoritative army medical source, who asked not to be quoted by name, said Saturday night "a complete switch-over" to the plasma substitute has been put into effect, following "utterly convincing" tests of dextran during the last few months.

The army official emphasized however that there was still a vital need of whole-blood donations from the public because of other uses.

"We have now begun to fill all orders from domestic and overseas theatres with dextran instead of plasma."

He said that supplies of plasma already stockpiled in overseas theatres would be used up on certain kind of cases where plasma gives better nutritional support than does dextran.


But he added that a blood faction known as "serum albumin" can also give this nutritional support and efforts are already under way to increase the army's supply.

"Our northland," Heintzleman asserted, "has many resources which the world needs." But they must be "evaluated properly, brought to the attention of prospective enterprises and the way smoothed for their development by removal of obstacles to investment capital."

Federal spending, he indicat ed, was an obstacle to the indigenous development of the north

"The economy of the territory is presently far too dependent on federal spending for defence. to be healthy, and we must bring more of the natural resources into use to take up the slack when defence construction appropriations stop or are greatly curtailed."

Heintzleman pointed to three projects as outstanding for the future of the northland. They were the Kitimat aluminum project, the pulp mill of the Columbia Cellulose Company at Prince Rupert and the Ketchikan pulp mill, sponsored by the Puget Sound Pulp Co, and the American Viscose Co., the latter is the only one in Alaska.
