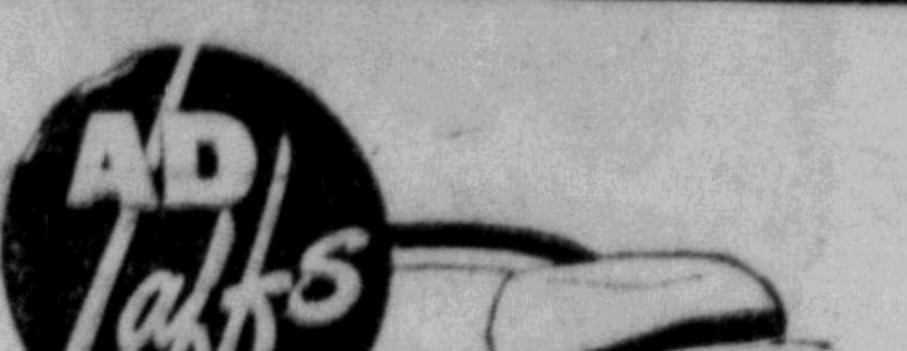

BLACKWOOD on Bridge

Muzzy, Alas, Didn't Know When To Use Safety Play

"What's the use of learning all those safety plays?" asked Mr. Muzzy. "They come up so seldom."

"They come up often enough," replied Mr. Champion caustically. "You just do not recognize them."

I suggest that Mr. Champion's reply is worth some quiet thought.

The spade slam in today's deal was makeable against any defense but Mr. Muzzy managed to go down one. He yelled loud and long about his bad luck. Let's see how unlucky he actually was.

Mr. Dale opened the jack of clubs. Mr. Muzzy won with the king and planked down the ace of trumps! Now Mrs. Keen was bound to win two tricks in the trump suit.

With a trump suit like this, the standard safety play is to lead first from the hand with two honors. In other words, Mr. Muzzy's first play in the spade suit should have been the king.

Assuming the first club trick is won in the closed hand, lead a small spade.

In this particular deal Mr. Dale would have shown out. Play the king from dummy, then and return a small spade.

If Mrs. Keen splits her honors, the ace will win the second trick and now with jack, nine, eight and seven left in the two hands, it is a simple matter to knock out the other outstanding honor and, later, pick up Mrs. Keen's fourth trump.

If Mrs. Keen should duck the second spade lead, the nine would win in the closed hand. The ace would pick up the ten and the queen would be the only winner for the defense.

Suppose Mr. Dale had followed suit to the first trump lead. Go up with the king in dummy as before. If Mrs. Keen shows out, lead a small spade back to the ace and another spade toward dummy's jack. Mr. Dale would win with the queen of spades, but the jack would pick up his ten later.

So Mr. Muzzy had no justified complaint about his luck. Remember, it is necessary not only to know how to play suits for safety—but also to recognize the situation where you should put that knowledge to work.
