NEW YORK.—New York Giants combined extra base-hitting with the fine four-hit pitching of Jim Hearn to defeat Brooklyn Dodgers 6-2 yesterday and stretch their first place lead to 2½ games over their arch National League rivals.

Stage Set For International Series Opener

Final arrangements for the Sunday opener of Ketchikan-Prince Rupert International series were made last night at a meeting of the baseball commis-

sion. A lineup of 19 picked players from the three Rupert teams will be given to playing manager Cliff Dahl from which to choose his playing lineup.

Players have been categorized into four classifications: pitchers, catchers, infielders and outfielders. Dahl, an infielder himself, will designate positions the players will hold.

Meanwhile, complete authority has been given the commission to handle all arrangements where individual teams or all-star representation will play ball outside of the city, said Commissioner Eddie Gladding.

Picked players include Lindsay, Letourneau, Christianson, Sharpe, Hawryluk and Fraser, as pitchers; Abel and Morgan, catchers; Scherk, Gunn, Giordano, Scott, Dahl (manager), and B.

Hearn, working with only two days' rest, fanned five and didn't walk a Dodger until the ninth inning.

Billy Loes, Brooklyn's youthful sensation, went down to his first defeat in six decisions as Giants collected eight hits, including a pair of double and a homer by Dave Williams, a triple by Whitey Lockman and a homer by Don Mueller.

The Ketchikan-Rupert opening duel will be a doubleheader Sunday afternoon at Roosevelt Park ball diamond, time to be announced.

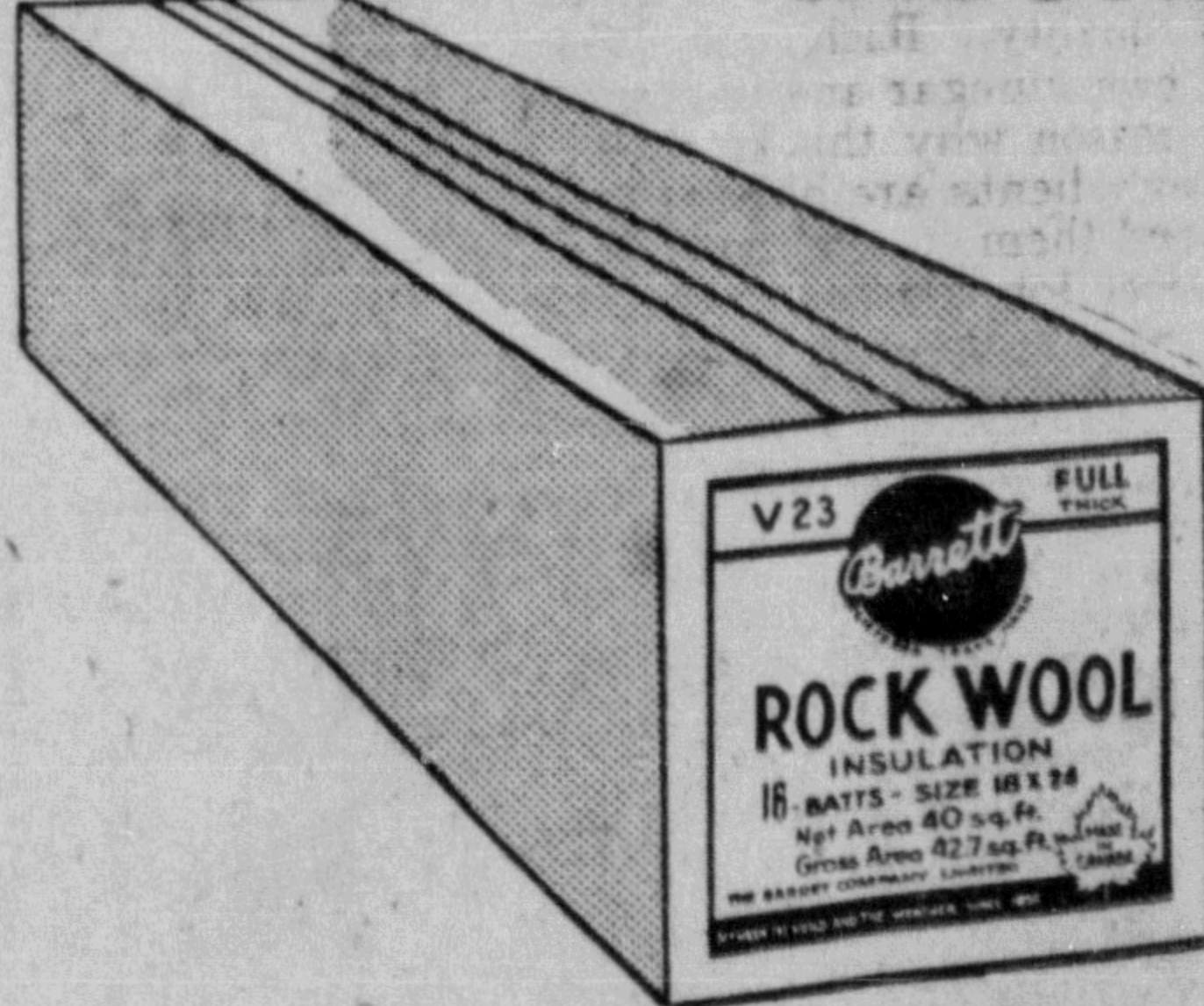

MONTREAL.—An 11-man squad, six of them from the Canadian champion Tillsonburg Livingstons, was announced today as Canada's basketball representatives at the Olympic Games.

Two were named from the University of Western Ontario and one each from Edmonton, Toronto Tri-Bels and Winnipeg University Grads.

Livingstons won the Canadian basketball championship last Friday, defeating Western Mustangs from London, Ont., 87-75 to take the best of five series 3-1.

Livingstons took the first two games 79-65 and 75-69 and Western took the third 83-82.

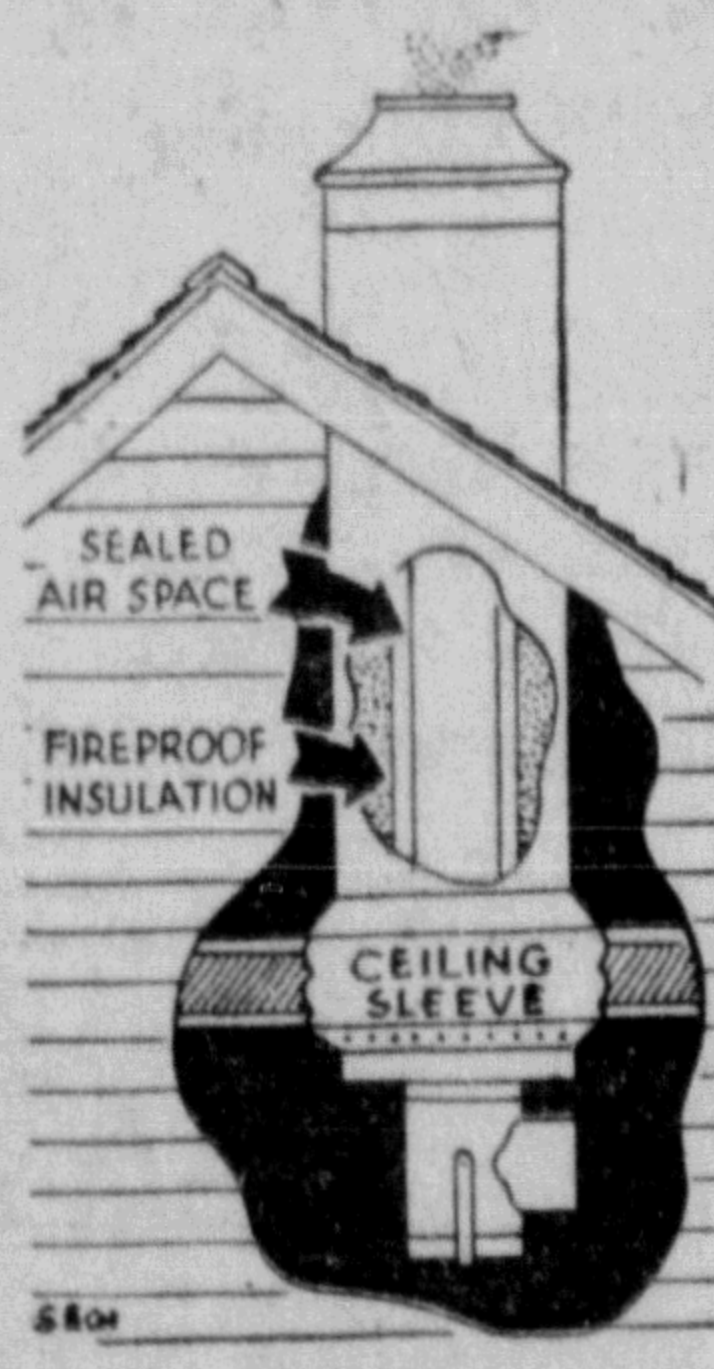
