

LONDON (AP) - The Grand National, the world's most famous and unpredictable steeplechase, will be run Saturday at

If you're looking for a winner you'd better get the old hatpin

sharpened up. For years, science and the bookies have proved that the hatpin method is by far the most reliable for finding the winner of this free-for-all where the favorite almost never wins and where most of the field never

sees the finish line. Fifty-two horses, including two previous winners, are eligible to start in the 41/2-mile chase over 30 of the toughest fences on any race course. Veteran observers agree that the horse ever finishing are at least 10 to 1.

The shortest price at the moment, as far as possible winners are concerned, is a fraction more than that. J. H. Griffin's Irishbred Royal Tan heads the list at 100 to 9.

Royal Tan, an eight-year-old gelding, finished second to Nickel Coin last year. They were the only two horses of a starting field of 36 to finish the course without falling.
