

## Remember When Soccer Team Forefeits Game

Vancouver's fighting Irishman Jimmy McLarnin won the world's welterweight championship 20 years ago tonight by knocking out Young Corbett in 2:27 of the first round in a scheduled 34-rounder at Los Angeles. He lost the title to Barney Ross and regained it in 1934, before giving way again to Ross in 1935.

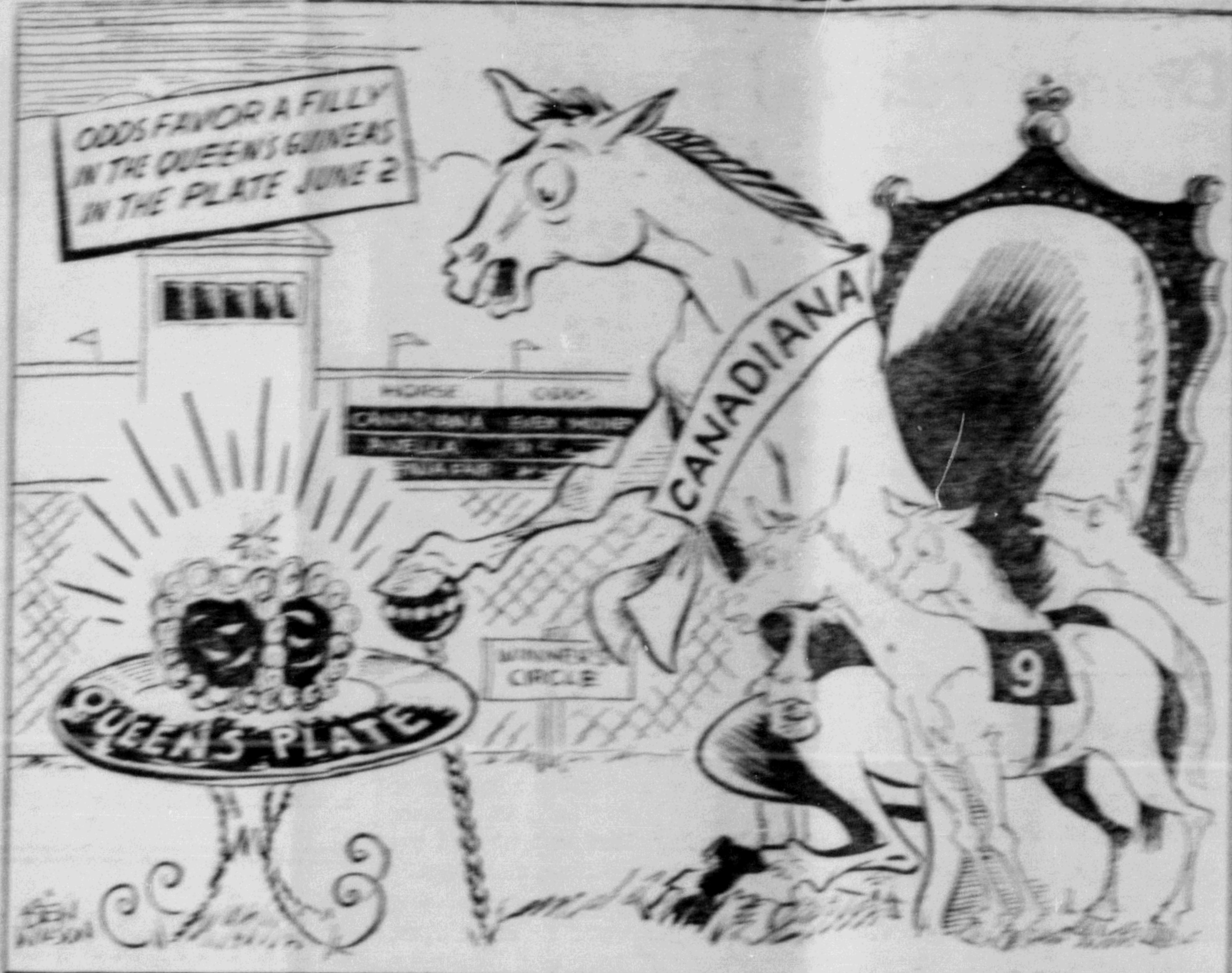

## Bulldozers to Start Next Month On Construction of BEG Stadium

VANCOUVER (CP)—The 1954 British Empire and Commonwealth Games here are responsible for probably the world's biggest dirt.  
Some time next month after the honorary games chairman, Mayor Fred Hume of Vancouver, returns from the Coronation, that dirt will be dug.  
After appropriate ceremonies, bulldozers will slice into a neat little nine-hole golf course to dig the foundation for the games' big site—a \$1,365,000 stadium.

With 26,511 permanent concrete seats, the horseshoe-shaped stadium is to be built on the grounds of the Pacific National Exhibition. The PNE gets "sole custody, control and management" of the stadium after the games.  
And if there's a thought that June, 1953, is none too soon to start construction of such a giant stadium for use at the end of July, 1954—relax. Construction work can be carried out the year round in balmy Vancouver.  
On top of the 26,511 permanent seats now planned, the end

of the horseshoe may be closed in with temporary bleachers if necessary, boosting the capacity to 35,000.  
As an indication of progress in coping with the million-and-one details that go into such a world-wide sporting carnival as this—each seat now has a number, the tickets are designed and printing will soon begin.  
And—details again—your BEG ticket will be printed on water-marked paper, like a cheque, so that a ticket bought from the Fiji Islands guarantees that someone from South America, say, won't be sitting in your seat when you get here.  
Buying a ticket from Fiji is not just a dream, either. Send a Fiji postal money order, get a receipt and pick up the tickets on arrival. The actual ticket won't leave the country for bookkeeping reasons.  
Details . . . out when the approximately 600 athletes from an expected 23 countries show up for the eight-day event starting July 20, they'll find the new stadium, a new cycling track, a new 6,700-seat swimming pool, separate boxing, wrestling and weight-lifting arenas in existing buildings and an Empire Games village on the University of British Columbia campus.

## Four Grunt-Groan Experts To Take Ring at Same Time

When two hefty over-200-pounders get in the wrestling ring together to create mayhem with each other, it gets interesting, but wrestling fans here will get a special treat Saturday when four of the toughest boys on the west coast pile into each other all at once.  
This will be the team match—two against two—and help the losers.  
This is just a preview of the wrestling show which begins tonight at the Civic Centre when Bud "Lil Abner" Rattal tackles Tarzan Zimba and Chief Thun-

derbird tries to nail Cliff Parker.  
Each match will be a two-of-three fall event, hour limit.  
About the roughest, toughest grunt 'n groan experts on the continent, these four will probably comprise the heaviest quartet ever flown into this city. They arrive today from Washington and Vancouver.  
First matches on Saturday night will feature Friday's winners against each other, and the losers against each other.  
Feature attraction will be the team match. Reserve tickets are still available at the Civic Centre.

## Plan to Isolate Doukhobors Drawn up by Attorney-General

VANCOUVER (CP)—A plan to isolate fanatical Sons of Freedom Doukhobors will be placed before the Federal government by British Columbia.  
Attorney-General Robert Bonner said at a meeting here that Federal authorities will be asked to consider a special law to make isolation possible.  
Mr. Bonner would have the radicals isolated "until they change their ways."  
He said provincial-federal cooperation is necessary to solve the Doukhobor problem.  
"The necessity for making some disposition of the Sons of Freedom," said Mr. Bonner, "will be apparent when it is recognized that their unlawful activities stem, not from criminal malice in the ordinary sense, but from their philosophy towards life which has been shaped by their religious convictions."  
Some of the "Sons" may choose to leave Canada this summer, he said, but the decision to relocate is not unanimous.

"For those who remain we suggest consideration be given to conferring upon them a special status by statute which will permit their removal to a place remote from non-Doukhobor settlements until such time as they shall cease to be either a menace or a worry to non-Doukhobor citizens."  
The homes of the 2,000 Sons of Freedom Doukhobors are in the West Kootenay, 250 miles east of Vancouver.

## Winning Streaks Cut Short

NEW YORK—A pair of long winning streaks by pitchers were ended Thursday in the American League while Brooklyn and Philadelphia tightened the first division race in the National League.

New York Yankees snapped Bob Porterfield's five-game string with a sixth-inning up-throwing that gave them a 7-2 verdict over Washington. Porterfield dropped his first three starts this season but hadn't been beaten in a month.  
At Philadelphia, the Athletics finally caught up with Mel Parrell. They whipped the Boston right-hander for the first time since April 29, 1951. The loss was also the first this year for Parrell, who had won six straight.

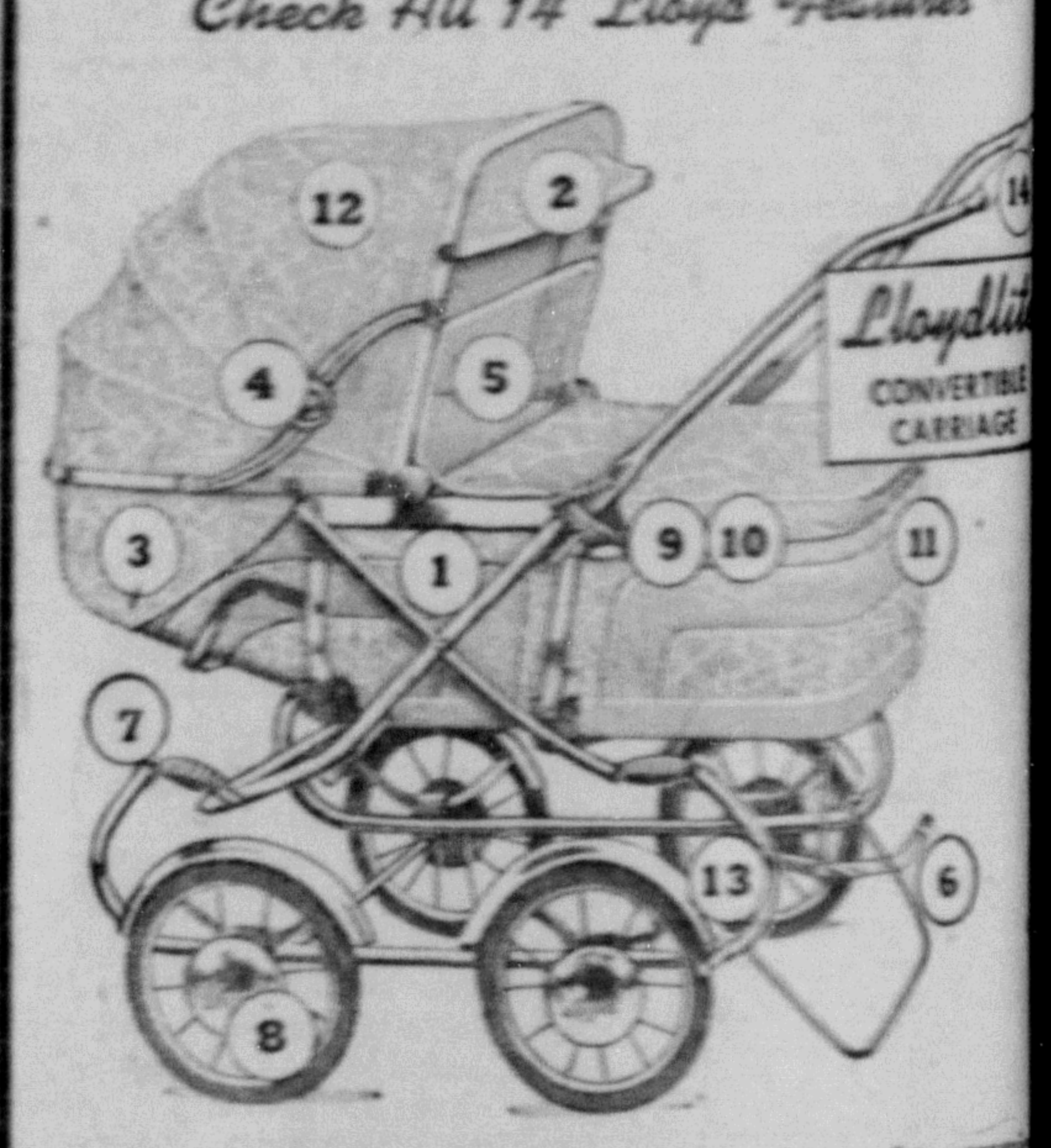
