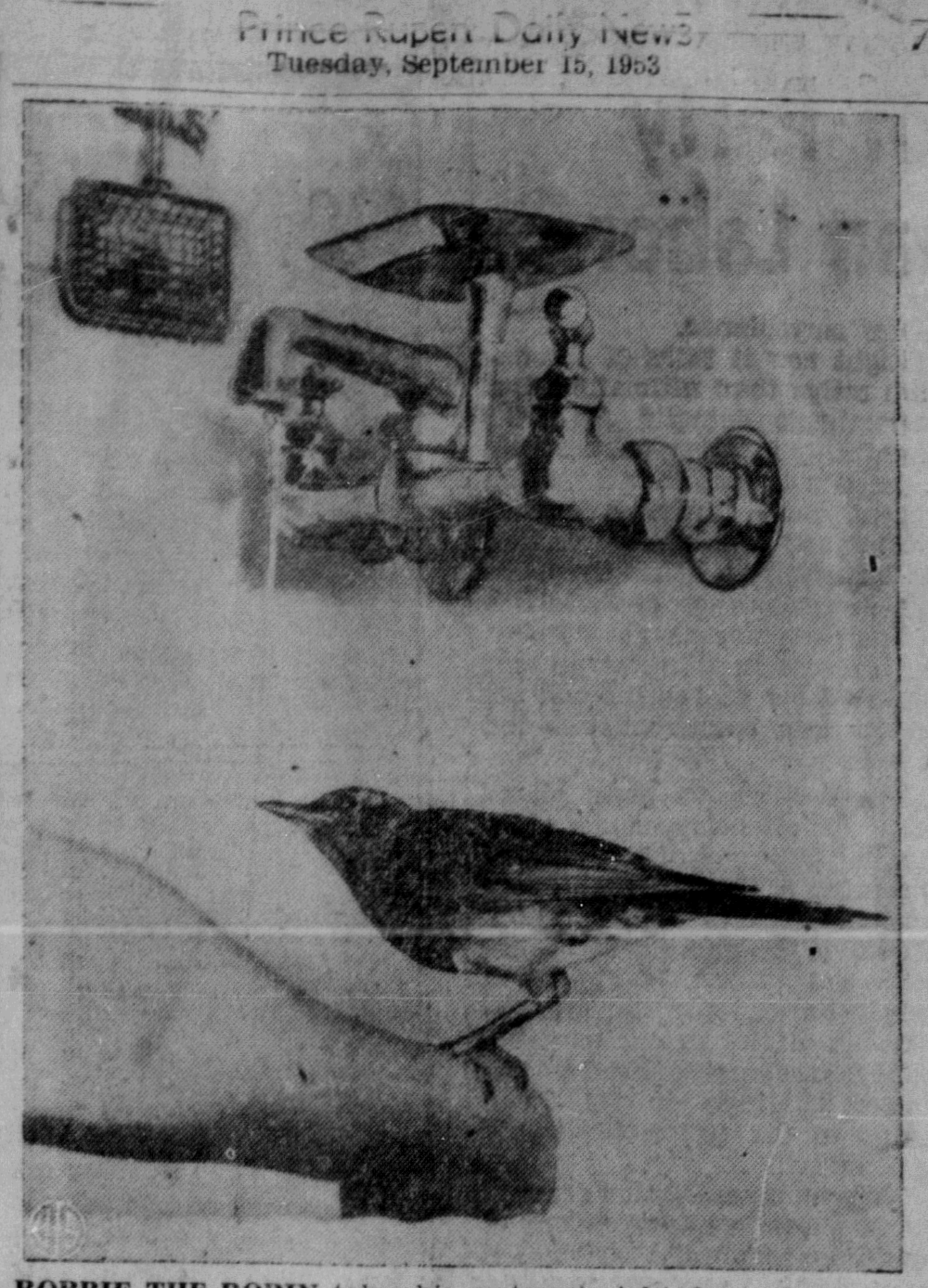

**Canada "Born"  
 At Sleepy B.C.  
 Whistlestop**

**CRAIGELLACHIE, B.C.** —  
 Canada, say the people of Craig-  
 ellachie, was conceived at a  
 table, but was born here, now a  
 flag stop on the main Canadian  
 Pacific Railway line about 300  
 miles west of Revelstoke.  
 Craigellachie has a small station,  
 water tower, four spur  
 tracks and a neatly-kept lawn.  
 Also, there is a simple cairn, on  
 which an engraved plaque reads:  
 "Here was driven the last spike  
 completing the Canadian Pacific  
 Railway from ocean to ocean,  
 Nov. 7, 1885."  
 There were not many people at  
 that great event, and there are  
 even less at Craigellachie today.  
 There now are about six railway  
 section workers, and about 25  
 farmers and loggers in the dis-  
 trict.  
**TRAINS DON'T STOP**  
 The trains don't stop at Craig-  
 ellachie today. There was a time  
 when they slowed up in tribute  
 during daylight hours, but the  
 only way you can see the monu-  
 ment is from the nearby Trans-  
 Canada Highway.  
 There was no impressive cere-  
 mony, and no golden spike. Wil-  
 liam Cornelius van Horne, a  
 tough Dutchman from Illinois  
 who became one of the driving  
 wheels in the CPR, was against  
 golden and silver spikes; some  
 American railroads which had  
 used them had ended in bank-  
 ruptcy.  
 When an ordinary spike, the  
 same kind used to hold track to  
 ties all across the country, had  
 been driven, van Horne was as-  
 ked to make a speech. He re-  
 sponded with an understated  
 ment:  
 "All I can say is that the work  
 has been well done in every  
 way."  
 But it has left its mark on  
 Canadian history. Andrew On-  
 derdonk, the contractor working  
 eastward from the coast, import-  
 ed 1,000 Chinese to ease the labor  
 shortage. They worked side by  
 side with unemployed clerks and  
 bartenders from San Francisco,  
 but were decimated by disease  
 and the rugged mountain coun-  
 try.  
 The Chinese laborers created  
 such a controversy in Ottawa  
 that the legislators were urged  
 to insert a clause in every CPR  
 contract that "no man wearing  
 his hair more than 5 1/2 inches in  
 length be eligible for employ-  
 ment."
