New Tribe of Pygmies Found By Danish-Born Professor

MANILA (AP) — A Danish-born professor has located the main band of a newly-discovered tribe of pygmies leading a primitive bow-and-arrow existence, practising polygamy and believing in good and bad fairies.

The tiny people, whose ancestors are believed to have migrated to the Philippines 10,000 years ago, have been caught up in the struggle between communism and democracy. They were driven out of their forest home by fierce Communist Huk guerrillas.

Dr. Tage Ellinger, Danish-born scientist now teaching at the University of the Philippines, first discovered a few of the pygmies, known as Abenlens, last month in the Huk area about 70 miles northwest of Manila.

The announcement of his finding stirred such interest that Ellinger decided to revisit the region in search of the main elements of the tribe.

Ellinger said he found the Abenlens had a high degree of intelligence and a "remarkably better" standard of living than the Negritos, the Philippine jungle tribe.

This is what he uncovered about the Abenlens:

The present chief is a four-foot-four man, 40 years old, known as Docot, which means grass.

An Abenlens male may take up to three wives. Divorce is not permitted. All wives are treated

as equals. Families are small. "I think there is an enormous degree of inbreeding because you see so few children," Ellinger said.

The Abenlens have rarely intermarried with the Negritos, and only in recent years.

The Abenlens believe that God made the earth. "They have no relations with God unless they are in trouble, and then they ask his help."

"They also believe in fairies—good ones who live in trees and bad ones who live in termite hills," said Ellinger. "That is why they never step on termites."

History Test Results Shock Masters

LEEDS, England (CP)—Results of a history test at Leeds University Institute of Education shocked the masters.

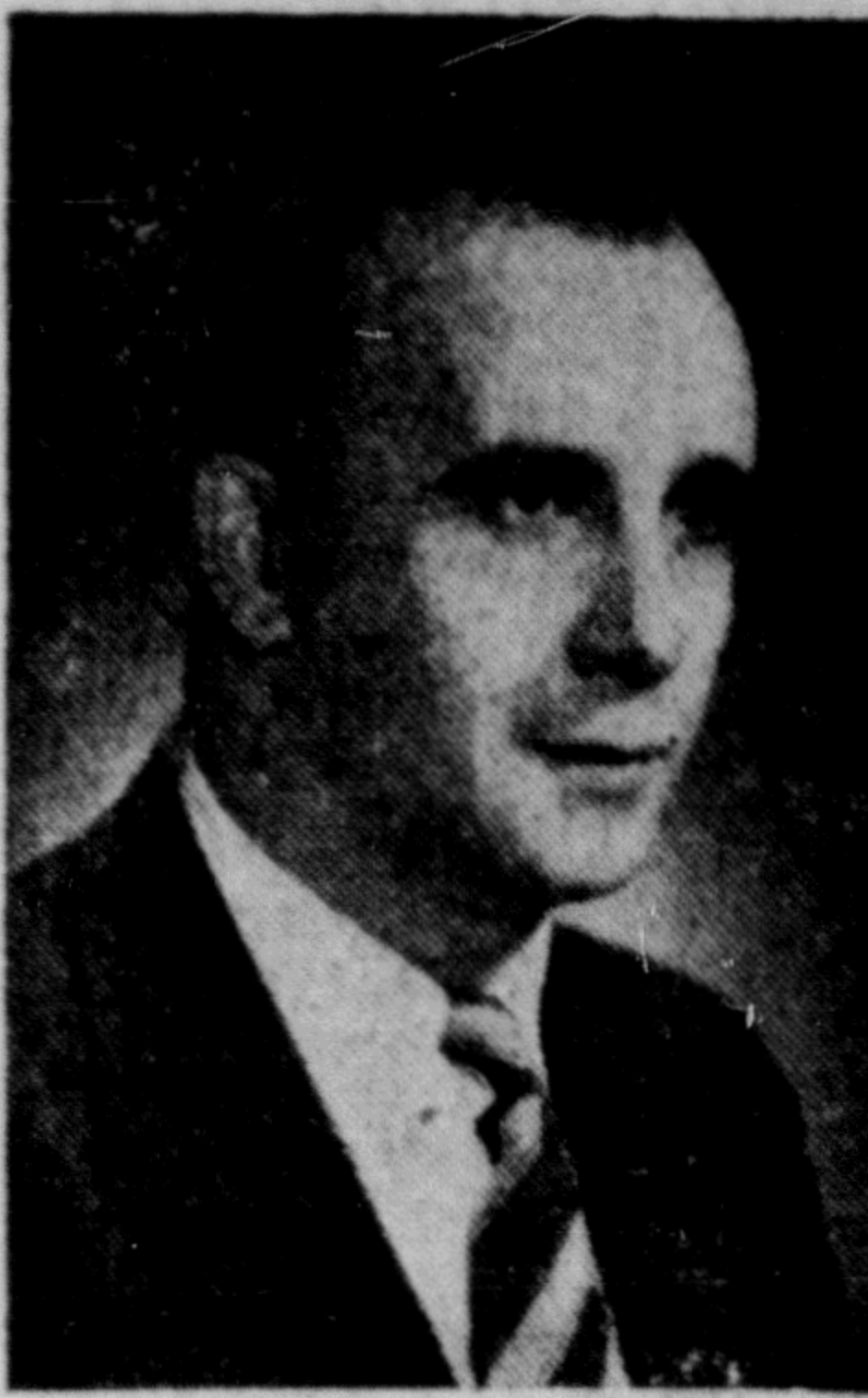

Appointment of THOMAS W. MORGAN as Superintendent Engineer has been announced by Union Steamships Ltd. Mr. Morgan, who takes over from Robert M. Logan, recently retired, is a chartered Marine Engineer and Associate of the Institute of Marine Engineers (U.K.). Following completion of his education, part of which was at Royal Technical College, Glasgow, Mr. Morgan was engaged in engineering projects and as a consultant in that city. Chef to Use Three-Foot Knife Carving Ox on Coronation Day

LONDON (CP)—The Coronation is going to mean a few food bonuses for the British people—but nothing as hearty or mouth-watering as the non-restricted fare of other coronations.

In fact, government concessions for the great occasion—a few extra ounces of margarine a person plus sugar and candy—fell a little flat. Newspaper editorials greeted them with thinly-veiled irony.

Still, there was one beefy sop to the stomach, recalling the lavish and meaty days when great roasts turned lazily on open-air spits. Anybody will be able to hold a Coronation ox barbeque—all you need is the ox, fuel and cook. And you've got to give the meat away.

Luckier than most centres is Wokington, Berkshire, which had either an ox or venison promised long ago to provide a party for the elder citizenry.

An 80-year-old member of the fire department, veteran of the 1937 coronation barbeque, is scheduled to start things at 10 p.m., the evening before Coronation Day. Oak log fuel will be lit in the town square, the ox will be spitted and the carcass shifted into grilling position on the steel tripod used first for the barbeque marking Queen Victoria's jubilee.

Delicious juices will be captured in special pans while the basting of hundreds of precious rations continues all night under the eye of the fire department.

Cook onion in melted butter until soft. Stir in curry powder; heat. Stir in soup and blend in 1 cup can milk. Add beans and heat thoroughly, but do not boil. Serve piping hot with a few snips of green onion or crumbled crisp bacon on top. Serves 3 to 4.

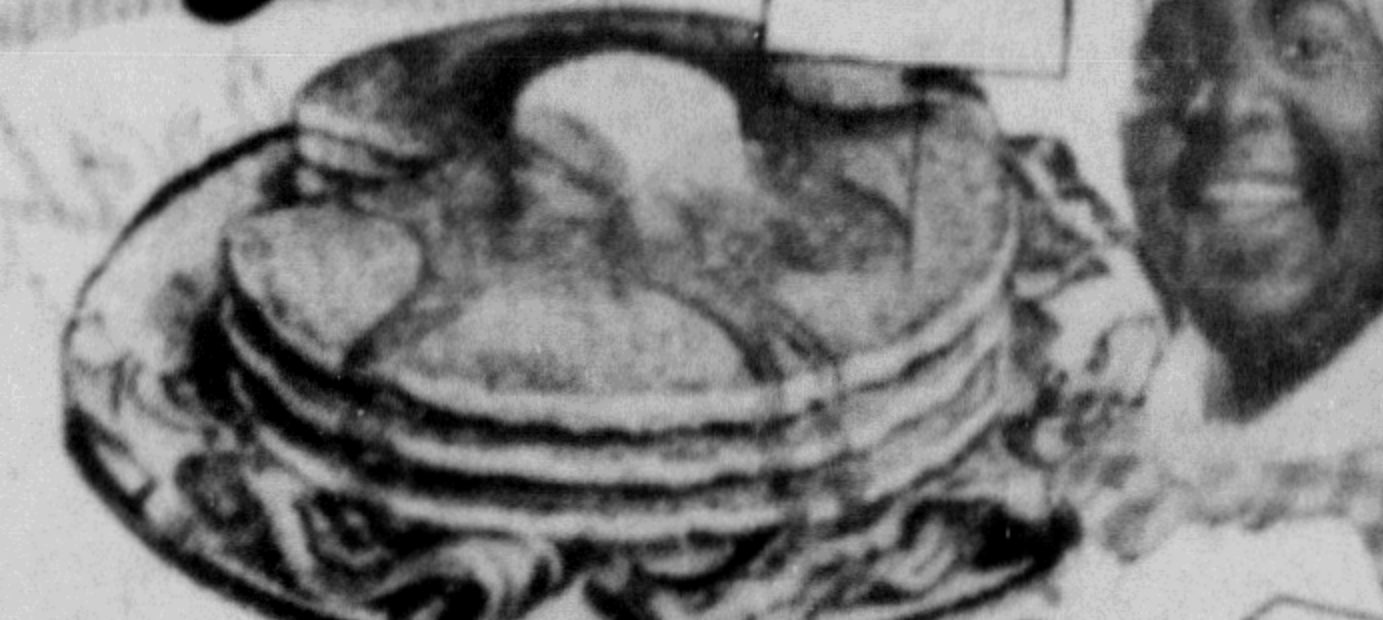
