MONTREAL — The Rt. Hon. Vincent Massey, of Port Hope, Ont., Canada's new Governor-General, headed the list of Canada's ten best dressed men, announced here by the Men's Fashion Council of Canada on the occasion of the Men's Apparel Fair, annual convention of clothing men.

Others on the list were Senator Rupert Davies of Kingston, Ont., because of his individuality in choice of clothes; Maurice "Rocket" Richard, star hockey player of Montreal, because he is emulated by thousands of his fans; The Hon. Lester Pearson of Ottawa, Minister of Foreign Affairs, because he is debonair always; Max Bell, Calgary publisher, because he is an ebullient Western dandy; Brigadier O. M. Martin, magistrate of Toronto, because of his meticulous choice of dress; Mr. Justice E. R. E.
