Red Wings Make It Sixth Straight Win

Gordie Howe Gets Two Goals in 4 to 2 Victory Over Boston

DETROIT (Canadian Press) — Gordie Howe scored two goals in the last eight minutes, capping a third period rally which brought the Detroit Red Wings a 4 to 2 victory over Boston Bruins here Monday night.

It was first place Detroit's sixth straight triumph, boosting its National Hockey League lead to fifteen points, the biggest of the season.

Howe's two goals were thirty-second and thirty-third of the season, tops in the National Hockey League. The last one was a 60-foot shot into an empty cage after Goalie Jim Henry had been pulled out with 55 seconds left.

Twice Boston held the lead. Dave Creighton counted his fifteenth goal of the year for the only counter in the first period. The Red Wings tied it up briefly on Glen Skov's tap of his own rebound.

The best that could be said about the Poles, who absorbed their fourth straight shellacking, is that they tried hard. In the hockey sense, they did not belong on the same ice as the Canadians.

Five teams among the nine entered in the round-robin tournament are still undefeated. Sweden heads the hockey standing with four straight victories.

Other undefeated teams are Canada, Czechoslovakia, Switzerland and the United States, each of which have had a bye in the series.
