
### SYMPHONY CONDUCTOR RUNS ODD DISC-JOCKEY SHOW

#### Fishermen Need Work Not Relief

ANCHORAGE, Alaska (AP) -Work projects rather than relief gifts were suggested here by two men familiar with conditions in the western Alaska fishing season disaster area.

The two are Jim Downey of the Bering Sea Fishermen's Union, and the Rev. Father George S. Endal, Jesuit priest whose headquarters are at Dil-

'A diligent inquiry reveals there is an immediate need for money and food in many instances in Iliamna and the Nushagak areas," Father Endal told the Anchorage Times.

"The instances of need," he continued, "will multiply with passing time." He said that because 50 and 75 per cent of the people there have no credit rating at stores, many went into winter with abnormally small grubstakes."

To relieve the situation, he aid, work is urgently needed and preferred to outright relief if any feasible project can be found."

Downey said other areas needing aid include Kvichak and Naknek on Kvichak Bay; Togiak Ugasik and Egegik. The latter two towns are on Alaska peninsula.
