Senate Group Scores CAB On Airlines
WASHINGTON (AP) — The chairman of the civil aeronautics board said today Alaska already has enough authorized air carriers to meet its needs.
 The CAB head, Oswald Ryan, also told the senate small business committee the board is "disturbed and surprised" to learn the committee believes it is hostile to the non-scheduled airlines and is harassing them.
 Ryan, referred to statements in the committee's recent annual report that the board is following the practice of "death by delay" and "strangulation by regulations" for the irregular airlines.
 "The board is not and never has conducted a 'war of attrition' against the irregular carriers," Ryan said.
 Senator Thye (R-Minn.), opening the hearing, said the committee long has been interested in the non-scheduled airlines because they pioneered the air freight and low-cost air coach fields, without a government subsidy.
 Thye said committee members have noted a constantly weakening position among the lines. "We would like to know what the CAB has done to assist them."

BLACKWOOD on Bridge

Heinsite Scouts Around For A Tip-Top Hand
 Mr. Heinsite is never completely satisfied with the result of any hand. His partner can make a redoubled grand slam and he will still manage to find some criticism of the bidding or play.
 In today's deal Mr. Meek won the first two tricks with the king and ace of spades. He then led a third spade, hoping his partner could ruff and drive a high trump honor out of Miss Brash's hand.
 Mr. Abel did ruff but Miss Brash, after considerable thought, refused to be uppeered and discarded the ten of diamonds. Mr. Abel returned the jack of clubs which was taken with the ace.
 Now Miss Brash laid down a high heart and Mr. Abel showed out, dropping a small diamond. She was unlucky to find the outstanding trumps divided 4-1. On the other hand, she now had almost a complete count on Mr. Meek's hand. He had shown up with six spades and four hearts and had followed suit to one lead of clubs. Thus he could not possibly have more than two cards left in the minor suits.
 This meant that the entire burden of guarding clubs and diamonds would fall upon Mr. Abel. So Miss Brash cashed her three remaining hearts. On the last one Mr. Abel was squeezed. He had to get down to five cards so he saved three clubs (which he had to do to prevent Miss Brash from winning four tricks in that suit) and got down to the queen-nine of diamonds.
 Miss Brash then cashed her ace and king of diamonds, entered dummy with the queen of clubs, led the good seven of diamonds and got rid of her losing club. The king of clubs took the tenth trick.
 "Open your hand with three no trump," said Mr. Heinsite. "You've got nine cold tricks."
 "Brilliant analysis," Miss Brash replied. "How stupid of me not to read your hand for three spades to the jack. And besides, playing all no trump I wouldn't be forced to score that annoying hundred honors."
