

Work of Local Artists Wins Approval As Large Crowd Visits Art Exhibition

Prince Rupert's home-grown artists can out-paint the Bobbaks, and many other artists too. That was the consensus of opinion among viewers at the Prince Rupert Art Club's spring exhibition.

Most visitors looked politely pained as they stared at the majority of the Bruno and Molly Bobak works and muttered to one another "What do you suppose he (or she) was trying to do?" But those expressions changed to delight as they viewed the work of some of the local artists.

The big display included work of Booth Memorial High school and Annunciation school students, plus work by members of the art club and others.

The Booth school work featured paintings illustrating stories heard on school radio broadcasts, and some impressionistic finger paintings in beautiful colors but weird patterns.

An interesting feature was a "scratch board" picture by Pat Deane in almost luminous colors,

depicting a feathery tree, rustic fence and pastoral background. There were other examples too of this interesting work in which paper is daubed with various colors, completely covered with black, and then scratched to let the colors show through.

In the Annunciation school display, some of the outstanding works were a watercolor fall scene by Anita Rogerson, a lake scene by R. Basso and an interesting portrayal of northern lights shining above a ship sailing a channel between dark mountains by Tony Toth.

In the adult art club section there were some outstanding paintings, including scenes by Ruth Harvey, featuring beautiful, rich colors, scenes and marvellous portraits by Kathleen Hill, plus a variety of other excellent works by other local amateurs, too numerous to mention.

The Bobak paintings, remarkable Karsh photographs and local art, plus a small display of photography by Bob Chidwick combine to form an interesting exhibition.
