

Urged To Join War Against Indo-China Reds

WASHINGTON — Senator William Jenner, Democrat from Indiana, yesterday urged the United States to "get ready" for a possible war against the Indo-China Reds by enlisting foreign powers to fight against the Communists.

Jenner called for support from President Eisenhower and Secretary of State Acheson. He said the United States should not be "passively accepted but should be met by united action."

Dulles gave no hint of what such action might take, and informed officials said it may hinge largely on responses of the British, French and other governments.

In the past, France has held to the view that the anti-Red Indo-China war is primarily a civil one. She has, however, accepted U.S. aid.

WANT SOLID FRONT

It now seems certain that a specific U.S. objective is the development of a solid front among the allied powers in the forthcoming Asian peace negotiations at Geneva, starting April 26.

In his speech, Douglas proposed that the presidency act immediately to "enlist the support and co-operation of Australia, New Zealand, Indonesia, Japan, the Philippines and other Far East nations in resisting aggression."

Canadian-Japanese Pact Tariffs, Aids Exports

OTTAWA — Canada and Japan signed a new trade agreement, which reduces tariffs on Japanese goods and provides for the exchange of most-favored-nation status.

The agreement, which was signed by Trade Minister Lester Pearson for Canada and Japanese Ambassador Koto Matsuzaki for Japan, will exchange most-favored-nation status with respect to duties and other trade rules and formal taxes and other trade matters.

The agreement becomes effective on April 1, 1954, and will be valid for one year.

Terms include: elimination of discriminatory trade restrictions on other countries; most-favored-nation treatment in the administration of exchange regulations; the imposition of temporary discriminatory trade restrictions and exchange regulations; the right of Canada to impose "values for duty" on Japanese goods; and the right of Japan to impose "values for duty" on Canadian goods.

The Japanese government will be cutting her imports from Japan.

Atomic Plants No Threat

MONTREAL — Production of power from atomic energy plants would constitute "no threat to existing hydro-electric installations," president J. A. Fuller of The Shawinigan Water and Power Company told an annual meeting of the shareholders today.

Nevertheless, several members of the company's staff are participating in studies being carried out by Atomic Energy of Canada Ltd., a crown corporation, Mr. Fuller said.

Mr. Fuller said power already is produced from atomic energy on an experimental basis but nobody knows "what the operating costs, on a commercial basis, will be. It would appear that complete answers to these questions are some five years away."
