





## Plywood Hamper Easy To Build



No washday aid, perhaps, of more use throughout the rest of the week than the clothes

Simple as a box, convenient a a third hand, the easy-to-build Douglas fir plywood hamper hown here fits neatly into either the bathroom or utility area

Front and side panels are of inch fir plywood. Holes for air should be spaced in the 1/2 nch hinged top. Bottom should be of heavier 3/4 inch plywood to give stability.

The frame of 3/8x1/2 inch strips an be assembled with and nails or use screws). The panels and quarter-round corners are similarly attached. The partition of the fir prywood namper can be nstalled using small, triangular strips to hold it in place.
