Secret Societies Flourish A-New In Singapore
SINGAPORE (Reuters)—A sudden stab in a narrow alley... tattoo marks... ritual oaths... revenge in the dark...
 These are the signs of Chinese secret societies which are again blossoming in the underworld of this outwardly-placid British colony.
 Police estimate there are 400 secret societies in Singapore. The police know of at least 10,000 members.
 Singapore's secret societies have their roots in ancient Chinese history and at times the ritual of the societies has been purely idealistic.
 But in Singapore, in recent years, the groups have deteriorated into little more than extortion gangs, glowering over a multitude of covering prostitutes, hawkers, coffee-stall proprietors, small traders and taxidancers.
 Each society has a group of "strong men" who go out to punish those who do not pay protection money.
 Almost 100 years ago, the fore-runners of today's societies fought a gang war. Six hundred persons were killed and 300 houses burned.
 From early times the religious colors for Easter has been white, symbol of joy, light and purity.
