

Anglican Bishop, Wife and Daughter Formally Welcomed to Prince Rupert

Rev. H. G. Watts, newly-ordained Anglican bishop here, and his wife and daughter, were last night formally welcomed to Prince Rupert by a dinner at the Anglican Cathedral Hall. Bishop Watts and his family are the first members of various representative groups in the diocese to be welcomed to the new and distinguished city.

President of the Anglican Men's Club which gave the well-attended dinner, E. Faure introduced the bishop and the groups they represented. Rev. L. J. Ministerial Association, Aid Mike Krueger, city F. E. Anfield, federal departments; Ormeville associations; R. J. educational establishments and trade unions; Father Roman Catholic native and Major Poulton, and native missions.

William Leask of Metlakatla spoke for the native people of the diocese. He remarked that Metlakatla "had the honor of having the first church in the diocese." He recalled that missionary work started there as early as 1862.

"My wife, my daughter and myself will be happy here and we intend to stay," Bishop Watts said.
