Three Groups Seek Further Study of Act

VICTORIA (P)—Two delegations representing three organizations have asked for further study of the alternative balloting system before the government throws it out.
Delegations from the Vancouver Board of Trade, which also represented the New Westminster Board of Trade, and the Victoria Chamber of Commerce both presented briefs supporting the alternative system.
They said the system which gives voters the first, second, third, etc., choice of candidates, was the most democratic.
The government has indicated it intends to amend the Elections Act to bring back the single choice ballot.
