## Board of Works Employee Loaned To Parks Board For Supervisory Job

Parks board commissioners last night considered themselves fortunate in securing the services of a city board of works employee as parks working foreman and supervisor for the summer months.

John Briglio was appointed to the position at a monthly salary of \$320 an da work project was outlined by the commissioners. When his parks work is completed, Mr. Briglio will return to the board of works.

Priority was placed on clearing McClymont Park of stumps, remaining after last summer's brushing job on the banks of Hays Creek. A bulldozer will be used to push the stumps together, then the pile will be burned. The area is to be sown in lawn.

Other work placed on the priority list included repairs to the Roosevelt Park grandstand, clearing of underbrush at West-

view, construction of handrails in Service Park and repair of tottem poles in city parks.

Commissioners were advised by the city board of works committee that their request for the

city to undertake repairs of the tottem was not approved.

The board of works said it considered the parks board with a 50 per cent greater budget this year than last "will find some way" to make the repairs.

A motion by Commissioner Bob Eby to purchase a power lawn mower in order to keep down the grass in parks "which is growing like hay" was defeated. Commissioner Charlie Balagno voted against the motion on the basis that the board should wait until next year, then purchase a high quality machine which present funds would not allow.

As there were only three commissioners present, including chairman Pat Forman, the latter's negative vote broke the tie. Commissioner Art Murray had left the meeting earlier to attend another meeting. Commissioner Bob Armstrong was absent.

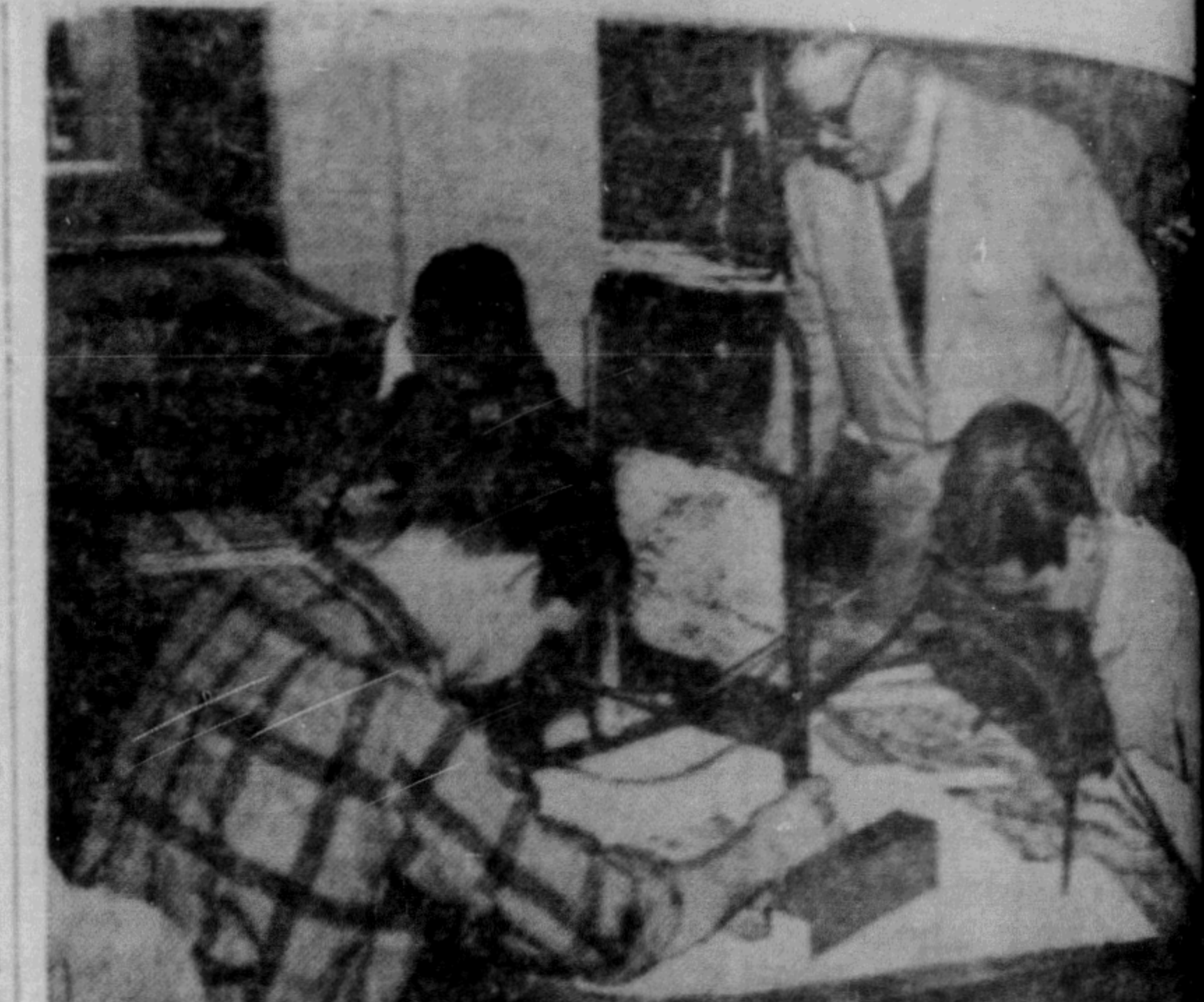
